- Any employee of the state or of any political subdivision of the state may authorize his employer to withhold from his salary a specific amount for such pay periods as may be
- designated, for payment of his dues to any professional state or local law enforcement or
- 21 firefighter association or union which is located or is operating a chapter within the
- 22 respective jurisdiction and to which the employee belongs. The employee must shall
- voluntarily execute and furnish to the employer a written and specific authorization for such
- deduction. Upon receipt of such authorization, and in accordance with the instructions
- contained therein, the employer shall begin to make such deductions. The amounts withheld
- shall be remitted forthwith to the organization designated by the employee. The provisions
- shall be relinited forthwith to the organization designated by the employee. The provisions
- of this Section shall not apply to any employee of the local sheriff's office or parish law
- 28 enforcement district."
