Abstract: Changes the criteria for a newspaper to be selected as a municipal official journal in certain circumstances.

<u>Present law</u> requires each parish, municipality, and school board, Orleans Parish excepted, to select a newspaper as its official journal. Defines "newspaper" as a publication that during each year of the five-year period prior to its selection meets all of the following criteria:

- (1) Has been published at regular intervals of not less than weekly.
- Originated and was published for the purpose of delivering news of general public interest and is not devoted to the interests or entertainment of any one particular group or class.
- (3) In more than half of its issues, contained less than 75% advertising.
- (4) Maintained a general paid circulation to paying subscribers within the publication area required.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> requires each municipality to select an official journal that is published in an office physically located within its municipal boundaries if a newspaper as defined in <u>present law</u> is published within its boundaries. Additionally provides that if no qualified newspaper is published within the municipal boundaries, a newspaper published in the parish in which the municipality is located which meets the requirements of a <u>present law</u> must be selected.

<u>Proposed law</u> instead requires a municipality to select an official journal published in an office physically located within its municipal boundaries if two or more publications that meet the <u>present law</u> definition of "newspaper" are published within its boundaries. Provides that if fewer than two publications that meet the <u>present law</u> definition of "newspaper" are published within the municipal boundaries, a municipality must select, as its official journal, a publication that meets the <u>present law</u> definition of "newspaper" and is published in the parish in which the municipality is located.
