DRUGS/PRESCRIPTION: Provides for access to prescription monitoring information by specialty courts

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 40:1007(E)(5), relative to the prescription monitoring program; to authorize
3	a specialty or treatment court representative to access prescription monitoring
4	information; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 40:1007(E)(5) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	§1007. Access to prescription monitoring information
8	* * *
9	E. The following persons, after successful completion of the educational
10	courses identified in R.S. 40:1008, may access prescription monitoring information
11	at no cost and in the same or similar manner, and for the same or similar purposes,
12	as those persons are authorized to access similar protected health information under
13	federal and state law and regulation:
14	* * *
15	(5) Designated representatives of any specialty or treatment court including
16	but not limited to a veterans, drug, DWI, behavioral, or mental health court. The
17	presiding judge of the court shall designate a court representative in writing to the
18	board. The court representative may access the program on the court's behalf in
19	order to review information about participants in the court's program or those
20	seeking admission to the program.

Abstract: Authorizes designated representatives of any specialty or treatment court to access the prescription monitoring program to review information about participants in the court's program or those seeking admission to the program.

<u>Present law</u> establishes the prescription monitoring system and provides that information submitted shall be protected health information not subject to public or open records law or disclosure. <u>Present law</u> establishes an exception to allow access to the information by certain persons who have successfully completed required educational courses.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds an exception to allow access by designated representatives of any specialty or treatment court including but not limited to a veterans, drug, DWI, behavioral, or mental health court to review information about participants in the court's program or those seeking admission to the program.
