HOUSE BILL NO. 571

SECRETARY OF STATE: Repeals requirement that the secretary of state print documents of the Louisiana Historical Association

1 AN ACT

2 To repeal Chapter 6 of Title 43 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S.  
3 43:231 and 232, relative to the secretary of state; to repeal provisions that require the  
4 secretary of state to print and deliver materials to the Louisiana Historical  
5 Association; and to provide for related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. Chapter 6 of Title 43 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950,  
8 comprised of R.S. 43:231 and 232, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

9 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not  
10 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature  
11 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If  
12 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become  
13 effective on the day following such approval.

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**Abstract:** Repeals provisions that require the secretary of state to print and deliver materials to the La. Historical Assoc.

Present law requires the secretary of state to print and deliver to the La. Historical Assoc. not to exceed 2,000 copies each of its journal and such other materials as the association may desire to publish. Further provides that the cost of the printing and delivery of such journals and other materials shall be at the expense of the state, to be paid for out of funds appropriated for such purposes. Requires the association to pay for copies in excess of 2,000. Proposed law repeals present law.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
