

may choose to not waive their right to privacy, and that if they are harassed, they can take legal action. Each applicant shall be told that he is not required by the state to accept the "gold star" or the REAL ID. Each applicant shall certify in writing that they have been given information related to the issuance of the REAL ID.

Proposed law provides that any documents collected from a person applying for a REAL ID in La. may not be released to anyone except La. law enforcement agencies, the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections (DPS&C), the U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security, and the FBI. The database containing information from the documents collected from applicants for the REAL ID card in La. shall not have any interoperability with any international database. Any person who illegally accesses or releases the data shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$10,000 and six months in jail for each offense.

Proposed law provides that compliance with REAL ID shall be limited to those standards in effect as of Jan. 1, 2016. Provides that any subsequent changes or additions to federal laws or rules for implementation of REAL ID shall be implemented by the state if and only if such changes are approved by the legislature by a favorable vote of a majority of the elected members of each house.

Present law (Act No. 807 of the 2008 R.S.) directs DPS&C, including the office of motor vehicles, not to implement the provisions of the REAL ID Act.

Proposed law repeals present law.

Present law (Act No. 151 of the 2010 R.S.) directs DPS&C, including the office of motor vehicles, not to implement the provisions of the PASS ID Act.

Proposed law repeals present law.
