5	WHEREAS, a strong upper level storm system caused thunderstorms across the state
6	of Louisiana from March 9 through March 12, 2016; and
7	WHEREAS, nearly five thousand homes in Louisiana were damaged by widespread
8	flooding, and at least four deaths were reported, including that of an elderly man and a young
9	child; and
10	WHEREAS, the March 2016 floods were the most widespread non-hurricane
11	flooding that the Louisiana National Guard has ever responded to; the heavy downpours
12	submerged roads and cars, washed out bridges, and forced residents to flee from their homes;

14	WHEREAS, nearly 1,400 soldiers and air crews worked in the flooded areas
15	throughout the state, deploying in high-water vehicles, boats, and helicopters; and
