Subject: Homestead Exemption Fraud

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Creates the crime of homestead exemption fraud

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that it is unlawful for someone to intentionally claim more than one homestead exemption. <u>Proposed law</u> provides criminal penalties which require imprisonment for up to 6 months or a maximum fine of \$500, or both.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on state governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. However, proposed law may result in an indeterminable increase in expenditures for local governing authorities if a defendant is convicted of intentionally claiming more than one homestead exemption. The proposed law creates a misdemeanor offense with a maximum imprisonment term of 6 months.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

The proposed legislation may result in an indeterminable increase in local funds revenue as a result of potential fines imposed for intentionally claiming more than one homestead exemption. The maximum fine is \$500.
