To express sincere and heartfelt condolences upon the death of former state representative

John Dean Travis.
WHEREAS, it was with deep regret and profound sorrow that the members of the
Legislature of Louisiana learned of the death of their friend and former colleague, John Dean
Travis, on Thursday, April 21, 2016, at the age of seventy-five; and
WHEREAS, John Dean Travis was widely respected, admired, and beloved as a
political leader and businessman; and
WHEREAS, Mr. Travis was born in Clinton and was a resident of Jackson; and
WHEREAS, from 1984 until 2000, Mr. Travis served as a highly effective member
of the Louisiana House of Representatives, and he used every opportunity as an able and
productive legislator to serve his constituency in East Baton Rouge Parish, East Feliciana
Parish, Livingston Parish, St. Helena Parish, Tangipahoa Parish, and West Feliciana Parish
and the citizens of the state of Louisiana in an honorable and dedicated manner; and
WHEREAS, Mr. Travis steadfastly endeavored to improve the welfare of his fellow
citizens, and his legislative accomplishments were numerous; he served with great diligence
as chairman of the House Committee on Commerce and as a member of the House
Committee on Agriculture, the House Committee on Judiciary, the House Committee on
House and Governmental Affairs, the House Committee on Labor and Industrial Relations,
the House Committee on Ways and Means, the Joint Legislative Committee on Capital
Outlay, the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, and the State Bond Commission; and

1 WHEREAS, Mr. Travis was the recipient of the Louisiana Municipal Association's 2 Legislator of the Month Award in August of 1987 and in May of 1991; and 3 WHEREAS, prior to his election to the House of Representatives, Mr. Travis served 4 as an alderman for the town of Jackson and served two six-year terms as a member of the 5 East Feliciana Parish School Board; and 6 WHEREAS, in 2000, Mr. Travis was appointed by Governor Mike Foster to serve 7 as chief of the State Office of Financial Institutions; he retired as the commissioner of this 8 office; and 9 WHEREAS, Mr. Travis was preceded in death by the love of his life, Norma Jean 10 LeBeouf Travis; his father, Hardy D. Travis; his mother, Quinnie B. Travis; and his sister, 11 Maxine Martin; and 12 WHEREAS, left to cherish his memory are his daughters, Saraphia T. Wilson and 13 her husband Josh and Sandra T. Allen and her husband Mitch; his sister, Shirley Day; his 14 brothers, George Travis and his wife Sonja, Billy Travis and his wife Louise, and Eugene 15 Travis and his wife Estelita; his grandchildren, Heath M. Allen, Heather A. Watson, and 16 Travis A. Allen; and his great-grandchildren, Madeline Elise Watson, Kody Eric Watson, 17 Maci Elizabeth Watson, Jayden Michael Allen, and Paisley Grace Allen; and 18 WHEREAS, those who knew Mr. Travis remember him as an iconic politician, and 19 they recall his engaging personality, wit, and tenacity; and 20 WHEREAS, the death of John Dean Travis has left a great void and created a 21 genuine sense of sorrow in all who knew him, including the members of the legislative 22 family, all of whom mourn the loss of this wonderful man who served his state and 23 community so well and so passionately; and 24 WHEREAS, John Dean Travis leaves behind a rich and unique legacy and is greatly 25 missed by all whose lives he touched through his commitment to public service and his 26 dedication to the citizens of Louisiana. 27 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby express sincere and heartfelt condolences upon the death of former state representative John 28 29 Dean Travis; does hereby recognize that his legacy of dedicated public service shall forever HLS 16RS-3171 ORIGINAL HCR NO. 106
