CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES Adds substances to Schedules II and IV of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law Page 1 of

Present law provides for the designation of controlled dangerous substances into Schedules I, II, III, IV, and V based upon the substances' potential for addiction and abuse. Proposed law adds exclusions to substances in Schedule II and adds new substances to Schedule IV.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable change in SGF expenditures. The proposed legislation may result in an indeterminable increase in SGF expenditures if a defendant is convicted of 1) unlawful production, manufacture, distribution, or dispensing or possession with intent to produce, manufacture, distribute, or dispense a controlled dangerous substance or controlled substance analogue classified in Schedule IV; 2) if a defendant is convicted of unlawful creation, distribution or possession with intent to distribute, a counterfeit controlled dangerous substance classified in Schedule IV as a result of certain additions to Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law. This legislation also adds exclusions to Schedule II that may result in an indeterminable decrease in SGF expenditures. The exact fiscal impact of the passage of this legislation is indeterminable, since it adds certain substances and adds certain exclusions to the list of Controlled Dangerous Substances and it is not known how many people will be convicted (as a result of Schedule IV) or no longer convicted (as a result of Schedule II). However, any offender (or no longer) sentenced to the custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections increases (or decreases) expenditures by \$24.39 per day per offender housed in local facilities. To the extent that offenders are sentenced and housed in state facilities, the cost per day per offender is \$51.68. Currently, the Department of Corrections houses approximately 50% of state offenders at the local level and 50% at the state level.

Note: The net impact of these changes is not known.

Under current law (R.S. 40:967) - Schedule II, sentencing guidelines provides that the penalty "...to produce, manufacture, distribute, or dispense or possess with the intent to produce, manufacture, distribute, or dispense..." includes maximum imprisonment terms of 30 years, with a maximum of at least 10 years served without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence in certain instances.

Under current law (R.S. 40:969) - Schedule IV, sentencing guidelines provides that the penalty "...to produce, manufacture, distribute, or dispense or possess with the intent to produce, manufacture, distribute, or dispense..." includes maximum imprisonment terms of 40 years, with a maximum of at least 10 years served without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence in certain instances.

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REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on state revenues as a result of this measure. However, there may be an indeterminable change in local funds revenue through the imposition of fines if imposed that would accrue to local government entities. Schedule II provides that in certain instances a maximum imposed fine "...to produce, manufacture, distribute, or dispense or possess with the intent to produce, manufacture, distribute, or dispense..." is \$600,000 and under Schedule IV it is \$100,000. Note: Exclusions were added to Schedule II, yet Schedule IV added new substances.
