AN ACT 1 2 To enact R.S. 46:1608(G), relative to senior centers; to provide for funding to nationally 3 certified senior centers; and to provide for related matters. 4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 5 Section 1. R.S. 46:1608(G) is hereby enacted to read as follows: §1608. Senior centers; appropriation; allocation of funds; Rapides Parish area 6 7 agency 8 9 G. The legislature may, if funds are available, appropriate annually to 10 all senior centers which possess a current national certification through the 11 National Institute of Senior Centers, and the National Council on Aging the sum of one hundred thousand dollars. 12 13 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature of the governor or, if not 14 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 15 16 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval. 17

<u>Present law</u> provides for the annual appropriation and allocation of funds to the various statewide senior centers.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that \$100,000 from the supplemental senior center funds may, if funds are available, be appropriated annually to senior centers which possess a current national certification.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
