## 1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

  - "B.(1) Without prescription or referral, a physical therapist may perform an initial evaluation or consultation of a screening nature to determine the need for physical therapy and may perform physical therapy or other services provided in Subsection C of this Section. However, implementation of physical therapy treatment shall otherwise be based on the prescription or referral of a person licensed to practice medicine, surgery, dentistry, podiatry, or chiropractic.
  - (2)(a) For the treatment of a specific condition, other than under the circumstances provided for in Subsection C of this Section, a physical therapist may implement physical therapy treatment with or without a prescription or referral of a person licensed to practice medicine, surgery, dentistry, podiatry, or chiropractic if the physical therapist meets one of the following criteria:
  - (i) The physical therapist has a doctorate in physical therapy and two years of clinical practice experience.
  - (ii) The physical therapist has a doctorate in physical therapy and a post-graduate certification.
  - (iii) The physical therapist has a doctorate in physical therapy and an American Board of Physical Therapy specialties board certification.
  - (iv) The physical therapist has a doctorate in physical therapy and residency or fellowship training.
  - (v) The physical therapist has five years of clinical practice experience.
  - (b) A physical therapist who provides treatment pursuant to this Paragraph shall provide notice to the appropriate healthcare provider within fifteen calendar days of implementing physical therapy treatment. If, after thirty calendar days of implementing physical therapy treatment, the patient has not made measurable or functional improvement, the physical therapist shall refer the patient to an appropriate healthcare provider. The board shall take appropriate

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1 2	disciplinary action against any physical therapist who fails to refer a patient pursuant to this Paragraph.
3	(3) No physical therapist shall render a medical diagnosis of an
4	acute or chronic condition.
5	C. Except as to an initial evaluation or consultation, as provided in
6	Subsection B of this Section, physical Physical therapy services may be
7	performed without a prescription or by referral only under any of the
8	following circumstances:
