HB 1134 2016 Regular Session Hazel

(KEYWORD, SUMMARY, AND DIGEST as amended by Senate committee amendments)

Requires the Department of Public Safety and Corrections to issue an economic hardship license under certain circumstances.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles from issuing an economic hardship license to a person whose driver's license is suspended and has not been renewed because of delinquent state taxes.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by requiring the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles to issue an economic hardship license to a person whose driver's license is suspended and has not been renewed because of delinquent state taxes. Specifies that the economic hardship license is valid for a period of one year or until such time as the individual has paid or made payment arrangements relative to his state tax delinquency.

Effective August 1, 2016.
