(KEYWORD, SUMMARY, AND DIGEST as amended by Senate committee amendments)

Authorizes the use of electronic signatures on temporary restraining orders and protective orders.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits electronic signatures for laws governing adoption, divorce, or other matters of family law.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but allows electronic signatures for petitions for temporary restraining orders and allows those orders to be served by facsimile.

(Amends R.S. 9:2603(B)(4)(a))

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary A to the engrossed bill

- 1. Deleted provisions allowing for electronic signatures for petitions for preliminary injunctions, permanent injunctions, and protective orders.
- 2. Added a provision allowing for legal service of the temporary restraining order by facsimile.
