2	To amend and reenact R.S. 14:46.2(A)(1) and (B)(2) and R.S. 15:541(2)(o) and (12)(b),
3	relative to human trafficking; to expand the crime of human trafficking to include
4	specific elements and penalties relative to the trafficking of persons under the age of
5	twenty-one years for the purpose of engaging in commercial sexual activity; to
6	require persons convicted of human trafficking to register as a sex offender when the
7	victim is under the age of twenty-one years; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 14:46.2(A)(1) and (B)(2) are hereby amended and reenacted to read
10	as follows:
11	§46.2. Human trafficking
12	A. It shall be unlawful:
13	(1)(a) For any person to knowingly recruit, harbor, transport, provide, solicit,
14	receive, isolate, entice, obtain, or maintain the use of another person through fraud,
15	force, or coercion to provide services or labor.
16	(b) For any person to knowingly recruit, harbor, transport, provide,
17	solicit, sell, purchase, receive, isolate, entice, obtain, or maintain the use of a
18	person under the age of twenty-one years for the purpose of engaging in
19	commercial sexual activity regardless of whether the person was recruited,
20	harbored, transported, provided, solicited, sold, purchased, received, isolated,
21	enticed, obtained, or maintained through fraud, force, or coercion. It shall not
22	be a defense to prosecution for a violation of the provisions of this

6	(2)(a) Whoever commits the crime of human trafficking when the services
7	include commercial sexual activity or any sexual conduct constituting a crime under
8	the laws of this state shall be fined not more than fifteen thousand dollars and shall
9	be imprisoned at hard labor for not more than twenty years.
10	(b) Whoever commits the crime of human trafficking in violation of the
11	provisions of Subparagraph (A)(1)(b) of this Section shall be fined not more
12	than fifty thousand dollars, imprisoned at hard labor for not less than fifteen
13	years, nor more than fifty years, or both.

15	Section 2. R.S. 15:541(2)(o) and (12)(b) are hereby amended and reenacted to read
16	as follows:
17	§541. Definitions
18	For the purposes of this Chapter, the definitions of terms in this Section shall
19	apply:

21	(2) "Aggravated offense" means a conviction for the perpetration or
22	attempted perpetration of, or conspiracy to commit, any of the following:

24	(o) Human trafficking (R.S. 14:46.2) when the trafficking involves a person
25	under the age of eighteen twenty-one years or when the services include commercial
26	sexual activity or any sexual conduct constituting a crime under the laws of this state.

28	(12) "Criminal offense against a victim who is a minor" for the purposes of
29	this Chapter means conviction for the perpetration or attempted perpetration of or
30	conspiracy to commit any of the following offenses:
