<u>Prior law</u> prohibited the holder of a retail dealer's permit for beverages of high and low alcoholic content and his agent, associate, employee, representative or servant to do or permit certain acts to be done on or about the licensed premises.

<u>Prior law</u> permitted live entertainment on a licensed premise, except no holder of a permit for beverages of high alcoholic content or low alcoholic content shall allow any person to perform acts or acts which simulate:

- (1) Sexual intercourse, masturbation, sodomy, bestiality, oral copulation, flagellation, or any sexual acts which are prohibited by law.
- (2) The touching, caressing, or fondling of the breast, buttocks, anus, or genitals.
- (3) The displaying of the pubic hair, anus, vulva, genitals, or nipple of the female breast.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that entertainers whose breasts or buttocks are exposed to view shall perform only on a stage at least 18 inches above the floor level and at least three feet removed from the nearest patron.

<u>New law</u> retains all restrictions and requirements in <u>prior law</u> but requires that entertainers who perform with exposed breasts or buttocks be age 21 or older.
