PRESCRIPTION: Provides a three-year liberative prescriptive period for actions arising from cases of sexual assault

	Synopsis of Senate Amendments
1.	Changes <u>proposed law</u> to apply to the prescriptive period for any act of <u>sexual</u> <u>assault</u> rather than <u>rape</u> .
2.	Clarifies that the <u>action</u> brought against the person is a <u>delictual action</u> .

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law</u> provides for a two-year prescriptive period to bring an action against a person for damages sustained from a crime of violence.

<u>Proposed law</u> extends the two-year prescriptive period to three years for a delictual action against a person for sexual assault.
