<u>Existing law</u> provides that any property or material alleged to constitute evidence of obscenity, video voyeurism, or pornography involving juveniles shall remain in the care, custody, and control of the court or the district attorney.

<u>New law</u> adds the investigating law enforcement agency to those authorized to have the care, custody, or control of such property or material.

<u>New law</u> provides that the material is considered contraband and shall not be disseminated or viewed by anyone not included in new and existing law.

Effective August 1, 2016.
