<u>Existing law</u> provides for parties that may petition for termination of parental rights and provides the grounds under which an individual's parental rights may be terminated.

<u>New law</u> adds the victim of a sex offense who is a custodial parent to the list of persons who may petition for termination of parental rights when the victim wishes to terminate the parental rights of the perpetrator.

<u>New law</u> expands the grounds for termination of parental rights to include an individual who has been convicted of or who has committed a sex offense defined in <u>existing law</u> (R.S. 15:541).

<u>New law</u> allows the petitioner's home address and parish, and that of each person for whom the petition is filed, to remain confidential when filing a petition for termination of parental rights of a sex offense perpetrator.

<u>New law</u> prohibits the collection of court costs from petitioners who seek to terminate parental rights of a sex offense perpetrator. Provides that the court costs, attorney fees, and other costs shall be paid by the perpetrator of the sex offense.

Effective August 1, 2016.
