Prior law authorized certain fees collected by the office of conservation as follows:

<u>New law</u> repeals <u>prior law</u> fees and authorizes a monthly fee payable to the office of conservation of 2ϕ per barrel of exploration and production waste delivered from the original generator of the waste to the following facilities:

- 1. Office of conservation permitted off-site commercial facilities.
- 2. Transfer stations permitted by the office of conservation for waste transfer to out-of-state treatment or disposal facilities.
- 3. Any other legally permitted La. off-site waste storage, treatment, or disposal facilities also approved by the office of conservation for the receipt of exploration and production waste.

<u>New law</u> prohibits exploration and production waste from including produced brine, produced water, or salvageable hydrocarbons bound for permitted salvage oil operators.

Effective August 1, 2016.
