<u>New law</u> requires the secretary of the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections to establish a special prestige license plate to be known as the "Louisiana The Energy State" license plate for passenger cars, pickup trucks, recreational vehicles, motorcycles, and vans.

<u>New law</u> authorizes the secretary to work in conjunction with the La. Oil and Gas Assoc. to select the color and design of the plate.

<u>New law</u> specifies that the license plate be issued, upon application, to any citizen of La. in the same manner as any other motor vehicle license plate.

<u>New law</u> requires the department to collect an annual royalty fee of \$25 for each plate issued and specifies that such fees be forwarded to the treasurer for deposit into the Oilfield Site Restoration Fund.

<u>New law</u> requires the department to collect a handling fee of \$3.50 for each plate, to be retained by the department to offset a portion of administrative costs.

New law requires the secretary to adopt rules and regulations to implement <u>new law</u>.

<u>New law</u> requires the secretary of the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections to establish a special prestige license plate for motor vehicles, restricted to passenger cars, pickup trucks, recreational vehicles, motorcycles, and vans, which may be issued upon application of any La. member of congress.

<u>New law</u> requires a one-time charge of \$25 for each plate, in addition to the standard motor vehicle license tax imposed by the state Constitution, and payment of a \$3.50 handling fee to be retained by the department to offset administrative costs.

<u>New law</u> requires the secretary to adopt rules and regulations as necessary to implement <u>new law</u> to include the transfer and disposition of the plates upon death of the recipient and the design of the plate.

Effective August 1, 2016.
