Interagency Transfers by (\$650,000) to be transferred to the State General Fund (Direct).

Additional increase (decrease) in appropriations for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 as follows:

Statutory Dedications by \$58,383,385; Fees and Self-generated Revenues by \$40,125,272; Interagency Transfers by \$1,585,468; and Federal Funds by (\$22,210,104).

Directs the commissioner of administration to reduce the appropriations contained in Act 17 and Act 47 of the 2016 R.S. out of the state general fund, statutory dedications, and fees and self-generated revenues by \$60 million for vacancies in state government excluding higher education. Directs reductions in statutory dedications and fees and self-generated revenues to be transferred to the state general fund.
