1 AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 33:2011(B), relative to occupational diseases; to provide with respect to the firefighters; to provide for the classification of certain types of cancer as occupational diseases or infirmities connected with the duties of a firefighter; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 33:2011(B) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

§2011. Development of cancer during employment in fire service; occupational

B. The disabling cancer referred to in Subsection A shall be limited to the types of cancer which may be caused by exposure to heat, smoke, radiation, or a known or suspected carcinogen as defined by the International Agency for Research on Cancer. The disabling cancer shall also be limited to a cancer originating in the bladder, brain, colon, liver, pancreas, skin, kidney, or gastrointestinal tract, and leukemia, lymphoma, and multiple myeloma, prostate cancer, and testicular cancer.

<u>Present law</u> classifies certain types of cancer as occupational diseases or infirmities connected with the duties of a firefighter.

<u>Present law</u> provides that cancers are included in the occupational diseases connected with the duties of a firefighter, but limits a disabling cancer to a cancer originating in the bladder, brain, colon, liver, pancreas, skin, kidney, or gastrointestinal tract, and leukemia, lymphoma, and multiple myeloma.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further provides that prostate cancer and testicular cancer are disabling cancers which are to be included as an occupational disease category for firefighters.

Effective August 1, 2017.
