Provides relative to terminology of court-ordered and other mandatory examinations in civil and administrative matters and

claims. (gov sig)

<u>Present law</u> provides that parties may obtain discovery in civil proceedings via mental and physical examinations. <u>Present law</u> provides that the court may order an examination of a person whose mental or physical capacity is in controversy for good cause shown. <u>Proposed law</u> adds references to such examinations as "compulsory" in the cases of workplace fitness disputes, medical disability disputes, and domestic abuse cases. <u>Proposed law</u> is effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of gubernatorial action.
