2	To commend Harold Clay Jr. on his many accomplishments.
3	WHEREAS, Harold Clay Jr. graduated from Warren Easton High in 1992; and
4	WHEREAS, Harold Clay Jr. graduated in 1998 with a bachelor's degree from Dillard
5	University in New Orleans, Louisiana, and later earned his master's degree from Tulane
6	University; and
7	WHEREAS, Mr. Clay worked for Associated Catholic Charities in two different
8	capacities, serving as the disciplinarian at Hope Haven Center for the on-site Jefferson Parish
9	School and later becoming the clinical manager of two sub-acute units; and
10	WHEREAS, for seven years, Mr. Clay worked in the field of criminal justice as a
11	homicide investigator for the Orleans Parish District Attorney's Office; and
12	WHEREAS, after Hurricane Katrina, he worked as a major case investigator for the
13	Fulton County District Attorney's Office in Atlanta, Georgia; and
14	WHEREAS, as an investigator, Mr. Clay appeared on court television and local news
15	stations in New Orleans, Louisiana, and Atlanta; and
16	WHEREAS, upon returning to New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina, he began
17	working at Florida Parishes Juvenile Detention Center as a forensic social worker; and
18	WHEREAS, Harold Clay Jr. worked as an adjunct instructor for Southern University

1	at New Orleans, Delgado Community College and Darryl S. Brister Bible College and
2	Theological Seminary; and
3	WHEREAS, Mr. Clay worked as a clinician for Family Services of Greater New
4	Orleans counseling children and families as well as facilitating domestic violence groups;
5	and
6	WHEREAS, in the fall of 2001, Mr. Clay wrote an article featured in the Louisiana
7	Counseling Association Journal explaining the use of his culture-centered approach working
8	with at-risk African-American males; and
9	WHEREAS, in March 2005, Mr. Clay coauthored an article published in the
10	International Journal for the Advancement of Counseling, "African Americans' Perceptions
11	of Mental Health Professions"; and
12	WHEREAS, realizing his passion for wanting to help at-risk youth with educational
13	challenges, Mr. Clay helped reopen Andrew H. Wilson Charter School in 2007, where he
14	served as an administrator for three years; and
15	WHEREAS, Harold Clay Jr. is now in his seventh year at Edna Karr High School,
16	having served as the assistant principal and school operations manager for the first four
17	years; and
18	WHEREAS, Harold Clay Jr. was named Head of School of Edna Karr High School
19	during the 2014-2015 school year making him the first African-American principal in the
20	school's fifty-year history; and
21	WHEREAS, because of his unconventional approaches to educational leadership, he
22	has garnered the attention of Bill Bradley, Ashton Kutcher, and Ellen DeGeneres, just to
23	name a few; and
24	WHEREAS, Mr. Clay has been featured in a number of articles and magazines such
25	as The National Review, StudentsFirst, and Epitome Magazine; and
26	WHEREAS, he has also received numerous awards and accolades both locally and
27	nationally for his leadership at Edna Karr High School; and
28	WHEREAS, Harold Clay's Jr. nontraditional work with youth has been illustrated
29	in three documentaries, "School Choice in New Orleans", "Disconnected Youth", and "Close
30	Ties: Tying on a New Tradition", which provides an intimate look at a rites of passage

ceremony that connects teenage boys with positive male roles models; and
WHEREAS, Harold Clay Jr. is a member of the School Leadership Center of Greater
New Orleans, the National Association of Secondary School Principals, the Louisiana

for Supervision and Curriculum Development; and
