EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

The proposed law establishes a \$250 maximum fee that the board can charge a course sponsor to review a continuing education course. Currently, the board charges course sponsors a fee \$100 to review a course that is less than 8 credit hours and \$150 to review a course that is 8 credit hours or more. Year to date in 2017, the board has collected approximately \$115K in fees from course sponsors. Under this bill, the 2017 collections would have been approximately \$260K, which is an increase of \$145K.

The proposed law further establishes a \$25 maximum fee that the board can charge a licensee to review a continuing education course. In current practice, the board charges \$25 for this purpose. The proposed law change codifies current practice. Therefore, there is no estimated effect on revenue collections by the board as a result of this measure.

Also, the proposed law allows graduates of a foreign physical therapy assistant school or applicants that have completed a U.S. armed services program not accredited by a national accreditation agency to qualify for a license as a physical therapy assistant. To the extent that new applicants apply for a license as a result of this measure, the board will collect an application fee of \$250 per applicant. However, it is anticipated that the number of new applicants will be minimal.
