<u>Existing law</u> authorizes a court to stay all or a portion of discovery in a pending civil action related to a criminal proceeding upon the motion of the district attorney.

Existing law provides that the motion to stay shall be heard by a contradictory hearing within 30 days of filing the motion, and provides additional procedures for lifting or terminating the stay.

<u>Prior law</u> excepted petitions or proceedings for divorce, custody, child support, visitation, or protective orders from application of existing law.

<u>New law</u> removes the <u>prior law</u> exception, authorizing a district attorney to move to stay all or a portion of discovery in actions for divorce, custody, child support, visitation, or protective orders.
