A RESOLUTION

To commend police officer Corporal Billy Aime for his service.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby commend Corporal Billy Aime for his service to the citizens of Baton Rouge and does hereby express sincerest hope for many years of safety in every aspect of police work for Corporal Aime and his fellow officers.
