Prior law provided for "obedience to signal indicating approach to train".

<u>New law</u> clarifies that the phrase "obedience to signal indicating approach to train" refers to motor vehicles approaching railroad crossings.

<u>Existing law</u> requires all motor vehicle operators to take certain precautions when approaching a railroad train.

<u>New law</u> retains <u>existing law</u> and adds on-track equipment as a railway vehicle that a motor vehicle driver must be cautious of when approaching railroad tracks.

Existing law requires the railroad to operate its trains in a safe manner.

<u>New law</u> adds that the railroad is also responsible for operating other on-track equipment in a safe manner.

<u>Prior law</u> specified that if a driver was involved in a collision at a railroad crossing or interfered with the movement of a train after driving past the railroad cross buck sign, the collision or interference was prima facie evidence of the driver's failure to yield the right of way.

<u>New law</u> specifies that if a driver is involved in a collision at a railroad crossing or interferes with the movement of a train or other on-track equipment after driving past the railroad cross buck sign, the collision or interference may be prima facie evidence of the driver's failure to yield if it is unrebutted.
