7	Section 1. Chapter 31 of Title 51 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950,
8	comprised of R.S. 51:2101 and 2102, is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	CHAPTER 31. INTERNET PROVIDERS
10	§2101. Internet providers; billing
11	All internet providers shall charge the customer for the actual internet
12	speed that is delivered, regardless of the speed plan purchased by the customer.
13	If a customer was charged for internet speed that was not delivered in any
14	month, the provider shall credit to the customer's account the amount
15	equivalent to the percentage of the internet speed that was not delivered within
16	thirty days of the billing cycle.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that all internet providers shall charge the customer for the actual internet speed that is delivered, regardless of the speed plan purchased by the customer. If a customer was charged for internet speed that was not delivered in any month, the provider shall credit to the customer's account the amount equivalent to the percentage of the internet speed that was not delivered within 30 days of the billing cycle.
