- E. The provisions of **Subsections A through D of** this Section shall be applied retroactively to July 1, 1996.
 - F. If the member's death resulted from an intentional act of violence and the member has a surviving spouse, minor, or handicapped or mentally incapacitated child or children, the amount of the total benefit shall equal one hundred percent of the member's average compensation. The benefit shall be shared equally by the surviving spouse and children. When a child who is not handicapped or mentally incapacitated no longer meets the definition of minor child under R.S. 11:403, his benefit shall cease, and the remaining beneficiaries shall have their shares adjusted accordingly.

§585. Death benefits of surviving spouse
A. If any member's death results

A. If any member's death results from injury received in the line of duty, survivor benefits shall be payable as provided for in accordance with this Section. This benefit is payable only if the member dies as a direct result of injuries sustained in the line of duty.

- **B.** The <u>benefit for the</u> surviving spouse of any member with twenty-five years or more of service with the department, or commission, whose death results from injury received in line of duty, shall be pensioned at seventy-five shall equal:
- (1) Seventy-five percent of his the member's average compensation if the member had twenty-five years or more of service with the department or commission.
- (2) and on sixty Sixty percent of his the member's average compensation if said employee the member had credit for less than twenty-five years of service with the department; or commission.
- (3) One hundred percent of the member's average compensation, regardless of years of service, if the member's death resulted from an intentional act of violence.
- <u>C.</u>; provided, however, that said pension <u>The survivor benefit</u> shall be paid only so long as she <u>the surviving spouse</u> is eligible under the provisions of this Subpart.

1	§586. Death benefits of minor children
2	A. If there is no surviving spouse to receive the pension due a widow of any
3	member benefit provided under R.S. 11:585, minor children of the deceased
4	member shall receive a monthly pension in the proportions set out as follows:

6	(5) If the member's death resulted from an intentional act of violence and
7	the member has a minor, or handicapped or mentally incapacitated child or
8	children, the amount of the total benefit shall equal one hundred percent of the
9	member's average compensation. The benefit shall be shared equally by the
10	children. When a child who is not handicapped or mentally incapacitated no
11	longer meets the definition of minor child under R.S. 11:403, his benefit shall
12	cease, and the remaining beneficiaries shall have their shares adjusted
13	accordingly.
14	B. When Except as otherwise provided in Paragraph (A)(5) of this
15	Section, when a child no longer meets the definition of minor child as provided in
16	R.S. 11:403, he shall receive no further benefits and the monthly pension shall be
17	reduced by the amount previously paid to him.
18	§587. Death benefits of parents
19	If there is no surviving spouse and no minor children eligible to receive a
20	benefit, a monthly pension of twenty-five percent of the average compensation of
21	the deceased member shall be paid to the parent or parents of the deceased member,
	if they, or either of them, derived their main support from the member. The pension
23	shall equal:
22 23 24	(1) One hundred percent of the member's average compensation if the
25	member's death resulted from an injury received in the line of duty, and such
26	injury resulted from an intentional act of violence.
27	(2) Twenty-five percent of the member's average compensation.

37	child under R.S. 11:403, his benefit shall cease, and the remaining beneficiaries
38	shall have their shares adjusted accordingly.
