GOVERNOR. Provides relative to powers of the governor during times of a disaster or emergency. (gov sig)

2	To amend and reenact R.S. $29:724(B)(1)$ and the introductory paragraph of (D) and to enact
3	R.S. 29:724(D)(8) and (9), relative to the Louisiana Homeland Security and
4	Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act; to provide for the powers of the governor
5	during a disaster or emergency; to remove the thirty day expiration date of certain
6	executive orders or proclamations; to authorize the suspension of liberative
7	prescription and peremptive periods; to authorize the extension of certain insurance
8	claims; and to provide for related matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. R.S. 29:724(B)(1) and the introductory paragraph of (D) are hereby
11	amended and reenacted, and R.S. $29:724(D)(8)$ and (9) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
12	§724. Powers of the governor
13	* * *
14	B.(1) A disaster or emergency, or both, shall be declared by executive order
15	or proclamation of the governor if he finds that a disaster or emergency has occurred
16	or the threat thereof is imminent. The state of disaster or emergency shall continue
17	until the governor finds that the threat of danger has passed or the disaster or

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	emergency has been dealt with to the extent that the emergency conditions no longer
	exist and terminates the state of disaster or emergency by executive order or
	proclamation, but no state of disaster or emergency may continue for longer than
	thirty days unless renewed by the governor.

	D. In addition to any other powers conferred upon the governor by law, he
	may do any or all of the following during a gubernatorially declared disaster or
	emergency:
	* * *
	(8) Suspend liberative prescription and peremptive periods for all legal
	proceedings by executive order or proclamation.
	(9) Extend the period in which residents may file a claim against an
	insurer pursuant to R.S. 22:868 by executive order or proclamation.
	* * *
	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
signed	l by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
by the	governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
vetoed	d by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
effect	ive on the day following such approval.

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	nt law provides that no state of disaster or emergency may continue for longer than 30 inless renewed by the governor.

Proposed law removes the present law 30-day requirement.

<u>Proposed law</u> allows the governor during a gubernatorially declared disaster or emergency to suspend liberative prescription and peremptive periods for all legal proceedings by executive order or proclamation, and to extend the period in which residents may file a claim against an insurer pursuant to R.S. 22:868 by executive order or proclamation.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
