SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 38

BY SENATOR PETERSON

LEGISLATIVE AGENCIES. Creates a legislative task force to study sexual harassment issues regarding legislators, lobbyists, and other persons interacting with the legislature.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1 2 To create and provide with respect to a special legislative task force to study and make recommendations with respect to preventing sexual harassment in the legislative 3 4 environment. 5 WHEREAS, sexual language, suggestions, innuendo, and advances are inappropriate 6 and, in many instances, unlawful in a work environment; and 7 WHEREAS, sexual harassment imposes psychological, physical, and other costs on 8 victims, including deprivation of career advancement and opportunities; and 9 WHEREAS, sexual harassment also imposes costs in the workplace including 10 decreased productivity, increased job turnover, reputational harm, and costly litigation; and 11 WHEREAS, because of these costs, it is often difficult for aggrieved persons to report instances of sexual harassment; and 12 13 WHEREAS, tracking and reporting instances of sexual harassment is perhaps more 14 difficult in the legislative environment because of the wide variety of participants interacting in the process; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the Legislature of Louisiana aspires to be a model legislative environment and engender an atmosphere of mutual respect and trust among all of the 17 participants in the process which include members of the public who regularly visit the state 18

2 officials, and other public servants; and 3 WHEREAS, the Legislature of Louisiana understands that the best way to end sexual 4 harassment in the legislative environment is to collaborate with all of participants in the process to study the current policies regarding prevention of sexual harassment, to make 5 6 recommendations regarding new policies or improvements to existing policies, and to 7 continually work to create a culture in which sexual harassment is not tolerated. 8 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 9 create a special legislative task force to study the prevention of sexual harassment in the 10 legislative environment in Louisiana. 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Legislative Task Force on the 12 Prevention of Sexual Harassment shall be composed of the following: 13 **(1)** The president of the Senate, or his designee. 14 (2) The speaker of the House of Representatives, or his designee. 15 The president pro tempore of the Senate, his designee. (3) 16 (4) The speaker pro tempore of the House of Representatives, or his designee. The chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, or his designee. 17 (5) 18 The chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, or his designee. (6) 19 (7) The chairman of the Senate and Governmental Affairs Committee, or his 20 designee. 21 The chairman of the House and Governmental Affairs Committee, or his (8) 22 designee. 23 (9) One member of the Senate and Governmental Affairs Committee appointed 24 by the chairman thereof. 25 (10)One member of the House and Governmental Affairs Committee appointed by the chairman thereof. 26 27 (11)Two members of the Women's Caucus selected by the members of the caucus in the Senate. 28 29 Two members of the Women's Caucus selected by the members of the caucus (12)30 in the House of Representatives.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the first meeting of the task force shall be called 5 by the president of the Senate within fifteen days after the adoption of this Resolution and 6 7 at such meeting, the task force shall select a chairman and any other officers the members 8 thereof deem appropriate. 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the president of the Senate and the speaker of 10 the House of Representatives shall assign appropriate staff to support the work of the task 11 force.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall report its findings and recommendations to the legislature no later than February 15, 2019.

Creates the Special Legislative Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment to study the prevention of sexual harassment in the legislative environment in Louisiana composed of:

- (1) The president of the Senate, or his designee.
- The speaker of the House of Representatives, or his designee. (2)
- The president pro tempore of the Senate, his designee. (3)
- **(4)** The speaker pro tempore of the House of Representatives, or his designee.
- The chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, or his designee. (5)
- (6) The chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, or his designee.
- The chairman of the Senate and Governmental Affairs Committee, or his designee. **(7)**
- The chairman of the House and Governmental Affairs Committee, or his designee. (8)
- One member of the Senate and Governmental Affairs Committee appointed by the (9) chairman thereof.
- (10)One member of the House and Governmental Affairs Committee appointed by the chairman thereof.

(11) Two members of the Women's Caucus selected by the members of the caucus in the Senate.

- (12) Two members of the Women's Caucus selected by the members of the caucus in the House of Representatives.
- (13) The secretary of the Senate.
- (14) The clerk of the House of Representatives.
- (15) Three members of the Association of Louisiana Lobbyists, including at least two female lobbyists, selected by the president of the association's board of directors.

Requires that the first meeting of the task force be called by the Senate president within 15 days after the adoption of the Resolution and at such meeting, the task force select a chairman and any other officers deemed appropriate. Provides that the Senate president and House speaker assign appropriate staff to support the work of the task force. Requires the task force to report findings and recommendations to the legislature no later than February 15, 2019.
