DIGEST 2018 Regular Session

Lambert

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the possession limit of three times the daily take limit for largemouth bass and spotted bass taken south of U.S. Hwy. 90. The fisherman must hold and be in possession of a valid recreational fishing license and show a landing receipt from a public boat launch that demonstrates that the fisherman was actively on the water or at a remote camp two days or more. Requires the fish to be kept in separate bags for each species of fish and requires that the bags be marked with the date the fish were taken, the species, the number of fish contained in the bag, and the name and license number of the person who took the fish. Provides that the fish be in the possession of the person who took the fish. Provides that the increased possession limit be null and void beginning July 1, 2016.

Proposed law retains present law but repeals the sunset provision of July 1, 2016.

SB 327 Reengrossed

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the possession limit of three times the daily take limit for red drum and spotted sea trout taken south of U.S. Hwy. 90. The fisherman must hold and be in possession of a valid recreational fishing license and show a landing receipt from a public boat launch that demonstrates that the fisherman was actively on the water or at a remote camp two days or more. Requires the fish to be kept in separate bags for each species of fish and requires that the bags be marked with the date the fish were taken, the species, the number of fish contained in the bag, and the name and license number of the person who took the fish. Provides that the fish be in the possession of the person who took the fish.

<u>Present law</u> provides that violations of saltwater recreational finfish possession limits constitute a class two violation but will be a class four violation if the possession limit is exceeded by 100%.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the possession limits set by <u>proposed law</u> for red drum and spotted sea trout south of U.S. Hwy. 90 can be classified as a class four violation if they are exceeded by 100%.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the punishment for violation of the size and possession limit for red drum is \$25 per fish under 16-inches in length or over the limit of five or in violation of limits established by the commission.

<u>Proposed law</u> includes the same punishment for violations of the limits set for red drum south of U.S. Hwy. 90 set by <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the punishment for spotted sea trout is punishable by a fine of \$25 per fish under twelve inches in total length or over the limit of 25 or in violation of limits established by the commission.

 $\underline{\underline{Proposed \ law}}$ includes the same punishment for violations of limits for spotted sea trout south of U.S. Hwy. 90 set by $\underline{proposed \ law}$.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
