CLERKS OF COURT: Provides for certain clerk of court filing requirements

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 24:516(A), relative to legislative auditor reports; to provide for
3	internet access to audit reports; to remove certain filing requirements and filing
4	timelines; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 24:516(A) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
7	§516. Reports
8	A.(1) The legislative auditor shall file copies of all audit reports released by
9	his office with the governor, the attorney general, and the office investigated. For
10	purposes of public inspection, the The legislative auditor shall file make available
11	via its website copies of all audit reports, whether prepared by his office or accepted
12	by the legislative auditor pursuant to R.S. 24:513(A) and R.S. 46:1064(B) with the
13	clerk of court of the parish within which the office investigated is domiciled, the
14	parishes of East Baton Rouge and Orleans excepted. Such copies may be filed
15	electronically; however, the legislative auditor shall make actual paper copies of
16	such reports available to any of these officials upon their request.
17	(2) The period during which the clerk of court is required, under the
18	provisions of this Subsection, to make an audit report of the legislative auditor
19	available for public inspection shall begin on the first regular scheduled work day

after expiration of three days from the time the report is filed in the office of the

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clerk of court and shall extend for a period of not less than one year. All such reports shall call attention to those matters required by governmental auditing standards, including reportable conditions, failure to comply with laws and regulations, and such additional matters that may be included in a management letter. Reports shall make specific recommendations for future avoidance together with management's response. If the report discloses any alleged criminal acts by any public officer or employee, the legislative auditor shall furnish an additional copy of the report to the district attorney of the parish where the offense was committed.

**Abstract:** Removes the legislative auditor's requirement to file copies of all audit reports with clerks of court.

<u>Present law</u> requires the legislative auditor to file copies of all audit reports with the governor, the attorney general, and the office investigated. Further requires the legislative auditor to file copies of all audit reports prepared by his office or accepted by his office in the clerk of court of the parish within which the office investigated is domiciled, except East Baton Rouge Parish and Orleans Parish. Requires clerks to make all reports available for public inspection for a period of time no less than one year starting on the first scheduled work day after expiration of three days from the time the report is filed in the office of the clerk of court. The reports are required to discuss all matters required by governmental auditing standards and recommendations.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the legislative auditor requires the legislative auditor to make all copies of audit reports available on its website and removes the requirements that the auditor file copies with clerks of court.
