CONDOLENCES. Expresses condolences upon the death of educator and former legislator, Dr. B. L. "Buddy" Shaw.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1 2 To express the sincere and heartfelt condolences of the Legislature of Louisiana upon the 3 passing of a beloved statesman and educator, the Honorable B. L. "Buddy" Shaw 4 EdD, of Shreveport, Louisiana. 5 WHEREAS, it is with deep remorse that the Legislature of Louisiana has learned of 6 the death of this remarkable public servant, Dr. Buddy Shaw, who served his community as 7 a teacher, principal, and school board member, then continued to serve the citizens of Caddo 8 and Bossier parishes as an elected member of both houses of the legislature; and 9 WHEREAS, born in the hamlet of Jamestown in Bienville Parish in 1933, Buddy 10 Shaw received both a bachelor of science degree and a master's degree in education from 11 Northwestern State University, and then received a doctorate in Education from Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Dr. Shaw knew the value of education and that the attainment of 14 knowledge was the basis of a better life for an individual as well as his community; the pursuit of learning was a personal goal that he imparted to the thousands of students who 15 came under his tutelage; and 16 17 WHEREAS, his illustrious career in teaching began in 1956 as a classroom teacher 18 at Hamilton Terrace Junior High, then as assistant principal at Youree Drive Junior High;

WHEREAS, his sixteen years at Byrd High School were the pinnacle of his teaching career with many rewarding moments; during that time Dr. Shaw was named a Danforth Fellow, an appointment which required an in-depth study of issues affecting BHS and possible solutions to address the problems; his efforts resulted in a comprehensive renovation of the campus and the origins of a STEM curricula and the mathematics and science magnet program; in 2000, he was proudly inducted into the Byrd High School Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, from 1987 until 1994, Dr. Shaw served as an elected member of the Caddo Parish School Board and served as its president in 1992; and

WHEREAS, for thirty-eight years, Dr. Shaw was a concerned schoolteacher, administrator, and supervisor who valued punctuality and personal effort and was remembered by staff and students alike for his tireless work ethic; and

WHEREAS, Buddy Shaw had the rare privilege of service in both houses of the Legislature of Louisiana for a combined total of twelve years, he was elected to District 6 of the House of Representatives from 1996 until 2004, and was later elected to District 37 of the Senate of Louisiana from 2008 until 2012; and

WHEREAS, as a legislator, Buddy Shaw embodied the best qualities of a public servant; he held a genuine interest in the people he served and felt a personal responsibility to represent all of his constituency with honesty and integrity; and

WHEREAS, while in the House of Representatives Dr. Shaw served as a member of the House committees on Education, Health and Welfare, Retirement, Environment, and Transportation, Highways and Public Works; and

WHEREAS, Senator Shaw held membership in the Senate committees on Education, Revenue and Fiscal Affairs, and Transportation, Highways and Public Works, and served as vice chairman of the Senate Environmental Quality Committee; and

WHEREAS, through his extraordinary talents for deliberation and good humor, he brought to fruition important legislation that included ethics reform, fiscal controls, tax reform, retirement, regional economic development, and transportation infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Shaw drew upon his invaluable experience in education to promote

2	WHEREAS, numerous civic, educational, and religious organizations benefitted
3	from his involvement as a member and president of the Louisiana School Boards
4	Association, as a member on the board of trustees of Northwestern State University and East
5	Texas Baptist University, as president of the NSU Alumni Association, and as a member of
6	Rotary Club of East Shreveport, Rotary International (District 6190); and
7	WHEREAS, as a lifelong Christian, he served his Creator as a deacon and member
8	of the Broadmoor Baptist Church; and
9	WHEREAS, Dr. Shaw felt a close affiliation to educational institutions he attended
10	and his generosity established scholarship endowments at the C.E. Byrd High School
11	Alumni Association, Northwestern State University, and East Texas Baptist University; and
12	WHEREAS, Dr. Buddy Shaw received many accolades and was quite honored to be
13	named to the Northwestern State University Hall of Distinguished Educators; and
14	WHEREAS, Dr. Shaw is survived by his wife, Dr. Mary Ann Neff Shaw; daughters
15	Stephanie Shaw, Mary Jane Lowder, and her husband Charles; son, Chris Minor; grandsons,
16	Charles "Preston" Lowder IV, and his wife Sarah; Dr. James David Lowder, and his wife
17	Katie; great-grandchildren, Mary Ellen Lowder, Molly Elizabeth Lowder, Charles "Charlie"
18	Preston Lowder V, and Huck Shaw Lowder, along with extended family and close friends;

20	WHEREAS, Dr. Buddy Shaw was an individual of remarkable intellect and a
21	creative thinker with respect to educational issues and brought this creativity to the daunting
22	tasks of educator and school administrator; he surmounted the considerable obstacles that
23	exist regarding improvements in education; and
24	WHEREAS, Dr. Shaw was a gifted educator and mentor for generations of students
25	who were bolstered by his motivation, and who strived to create successful lives and a better
26	world; and
27	WHEREAS, Dr. Buddy Shaw leaves a vast legacy to three generations of citizens
28	who have been affected by his public service to education and to local and state political
29	venues; "he served because he cared".
30	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
