CONSUMERS/PROTECTION: Provides relative to private actions with respect to the Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Law

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 51:1409(E), relative to the Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer
3	Protection Law; to provide relative to the prescription period of private actions; and
4	to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 51:1409(E) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
7	§1409. Private actions
8	* * *
9	E. The action provided by this section Section shall be prescribed by subject
10	to a liberative prescription of one year running from the time of the transaction or act
1	which gave rise to this right of action.

Abstract: Provides for a liberative prescription period with respect to private actions for violations of the Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Law.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes a person who suffers any ascertainable loss of money or movable property as a result of the use or employment by another person of an unfair or deceptive method, act, or unlawful practice to bring an action individually but not in a representative capacity to recover actual damages.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides that an action to recover actual damages is prescribed by one year running from the time of the transaction or act which gave rise to the right of action.

<u>Proposed law</u> amends <u>present law</u> to provide that such action to recover actual damages is subject to a liberative prescription of one year running from the time of the transaction or act which gave rise to the right of action.
