

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the joint committee shall specifically consider
2 hardware and software used by voters and elections administrators, funding, security, risk
3 assessment, verification procedures, post-election audits, time and places for voting, training,
4 the Louisiana Election Code and related rules, and any other matters the joint committee
5 deems appropriate.

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the joint committee shall solicit input,
7 recommendations, and advice from the following:

- 9 (2) The commissioner of elections.
- 10 (3) The attorney general.
- 11 (4) The Louisiana Clerks of Court Association.
- 12 (5) The Louisiana Registrars of Voters Association.
- 13 (6) The Police Jury Association of Louisiana.
- 14 (7) Each recognized political party.
- 15 (8) The Advocacy Center.
- 16 (9) The League of Women Voters.
- 17 (10) The U.S. Election Assistance Commission.
- 18 (11) The National Association of Secretaries of State.
- 19 (12) The National Conference of State Legislatures.
- 20 (13) The Council of State Governments.
- 21 (14) The Electronic Registration Information Center.

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the joint committee shall report its findings to
23 the legislature prior to the convening of the 2019 Regular Session of the Legislature.
