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TEACHERS/LEAVE Provides relative to maternity and adoptive leave for teachers

Present law requires school districts to grant leaves of absence to teachers and other eligible school personnel for a reasonable time before and after childbirth. Further provides additional extended leave for those granted such leaves of absence for illness of an infant, or for required medical visits certified by a physician as relating to infant or maternal health. Proposed law extends these provisions to include adoption.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There will be an indeterminable increase to local school districts, state special schools, and charter schools as a result of the proposed changes to maternity leave. The exact impact will vary across school districts and will be determined by the number of teachers and other eligible staff involved in qualifying events, the frequency of such events, the salaries and accrued leave of the individual taking leave, the cost of the substitute teacher, and the length of time substitute teachers will be required in the classroom.
