HOUSE BILL NO. 895 (Substitute for House Bill No. 575 by Representative Norton)

BY REPRESENTATIVE NORTON

CURRICULA: Provides for instruction on threats to school safety in public schools and public postsecondary education institutions

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 17:280.1 and 3399.16, relative to instruction in school safety in public schools
3	and public postsecondary education institutions; to require school officials and
4	campus security officers to provide information to students regarding potential
5	threats to school safety exhibited through online content; to provide for elements to
6	be included in such instruction; to provide a process for students to report online
7	content deemed potentially dangerous; to provide for confidentiality of personal
8	information about students who report such matters; and to provide for related
9	matters.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. This Act shall be known as and may be cited as the "Louisiana We Must
12	Save Our Children Act".
13	Section 2. R.S. 17:280.1 and 3399.16 are hereby enacted to read as follows:
14	§280.1. Safety education; recognition and reporting of potential threats to safety
15	A. Each public school, in consultation with local law enforcement agencies,
16	shall develop and distribute age and grade appropriate information to each student
17	in grades nine through twelve regarding internet and cell phone safety and online
18	content that is a potential threat to school safety. Such information shall include how
19	to recognize and report potential threats to school safety that are posted on the
20	internet, including but not limited to posts on social media.

11	and provide the following information:

13	(2) Information about the incident being reported including but not limited		
14	<u>to:</u>		
15	(a) Name of student, individual, or group who posted potentially dangerous		
16	content.		
17	(b) Date and time the post or website was viewed.		
18	(c) Social media outlet or website on which content was posted.		
19	(d) Type of threat to school safety that the content indicates.		
20	(3) A student reporting such a threat may submit photographic evidence of		
21	the online content. Such evidence may include any of the following:		
22	(a) A printed screenshot of the post and presenting hard copy.		
23	(b) Evidence of the post on a cell phone, tablet, or laptop computer.		
24	(4) A student in a grade below nine may report online content that he		
25	suspects is potentially dangerous.		
26	(5) Personal information of a student who reports such a threat shall be kept		
27	confidential.		
28	(6) For every threat reported, a school administrator shall record, on the form		
29	provided by this Subsection, the action taken by the school.		

1	D. If information presented to a school pursuant to Subsection C of this
2	Section is deemed a potential threat to school safety, the school shall present the
3	form and evidence to local law enforcement agencies. If the information poses an
4	immediate threat, school administrators shall follow procedures provided in R.S.
5	<u>17:416.16.</u>

8	A. The campus security officers of each institution, in consultation with local
9	law enforcement agencies, shall develop and distribute information to students on
10	the campus regarding internet and cell phone safety and online content that is a
11	potential threat to school safety. Such information shall include how to recognize
12	and report potential threats to school safety that are posted on the internet including
13	but not limited to posts on social media.
14	B. The information shall include the following:
15	(1) Instruction on how to detect potential threats to school safety exhibited
16	online, including on any social media platform.
17	(2) Visual examples of possible threats.
18	(3) The reporting process, as provided in Subsection C of this Section.
19	C. Institution administrators shall develop procedures for reporting potential

Abstract: Provides relative to guidelines and instruction in public schools and public postsecondary education institutions on potential threats to school safety and reporting of such threats.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires public schools and public postsecondary education institutions to offer information on recognizing and reporting potential threats to school safety that are posted on the internet. School and campus security officers or other persons deemed appropriate by the schools, in consultation with local law enforcement agencies, shall develop age and grade appropriate curriculum for students in grades nine and above.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires school officials and campus security officers to address the following, at a minimum, in the information distributed:

- (1) The ability to detect potential online threats to school safety.
- (2) The reporting system at the school or campus.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires school officials and campus security officers to further report online content to local law enforcement agencies, when it is deemed potentially dangerous. If content poses immediate threat at a public school, school administrators shall follow procedures provided by <u>present law</u> regarding school crisis management.
