CONDOLENCES. Expresses condolences upon the death of Judge Bernard Marcantel.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To express the sincere condolences of the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana upon the
3	death of Judge Bernard Marcantel.
4	WHEREAS, it is with deep regret and profound sorrow that the citizens of Louisiana
5	learned of the death of Judge Bernard Marcantel on May 9, 2018; and
6	WHEREAS, Bernard Marcantel was born on July 14, 1923, in Oberlin, Louisiana,
7	where he graduated valedictorian of his high school class; and
8	WHEREAS, he received his bachelor of science degree from the University of
9	Louisiana at Lafayette (ULL) in 1946 and his Juris Doctor from the University of Chicago
10	Law School in 1949; and
11	WHEREAS, while at the University of Chicago, he served as associate editor of the
12	Law Review from 1947 to 1948; and
13	WHEREAS, Judge Marcantel received a second Juris Doctor from Tulane University
14	Law School in 1950, and in 1953 was elected the youngest district attorney in Louisiana,
15	serving Jefferson Davis and Allen parishes; and
16	WHEREAS, Judge Marcantel was a practicing attorney in Jennings for sixty-eight
17	years and an active member of the American Bar Association, the Louisiana State Bar
18	Association, and the Jefferson Davis Bar Association since 1950; and

1	WHEREAS, he was honored by the Louisiana State Bar Association for more than
2	sixty years in the practice of law, served Jefferson Davis Parish as district attorney for the
3	31st Judicial District from 1953 to 1978, and judge for the city of Jennings and Ward II from
4	1985 to 1993; and
5	WHEREAS, Judge Marcantel also served as judge pro tempore for the 31st, 14th,
6	15th, and 36th Judicial Districts of Louisiana and the Third Circuit Court of Appeal; and
7	WHEREAS, he was the founding member of his law firm and has been practicing
8	law in Louisiana since 1950, making Marcantel, Marcantel, Wall and Pfeifer the oldest law
9	firm in Jefferson Davis Parish; and
10	WHEREAS, in his role as judge, he performed numerous weddings and the
11	participants always enjoyed his sometimes stern, sometimes light-hearted words of advice
12	to the newly married couple; and
13	WHEREAS, Judge Marcantel served in the United States Army during World War
14	II in the European Theatre of Operations and fought at the Battle of the Bulge in the
15	Ardennes Forest; and
16	WHEREAS, he was a member of American Legion Post #19 in Jennings for seventy-
17	one years and served as president of the board of directors of Jeff Davis Mortuary Benefit
18	Association for thirty-seven years; and
19	WHEREAS, Judge Marcantel received the Silver Beaver award from the Boy Scouts
20	of America and in 2010, he was named Citizen of the Year by the Jeff Davis Business
21	Alliance; and
22	WHEREAS, he was also a lifetime member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and
23	served as president of the ULL Alumni Association and later of the Senior ULL Alumni
24	Association; and
25	WHEREAS, he served as president of the Louisiana District Attorneys Association
26	and was later selected for Who's Who in America; and
27	WHEREAS, Judge Marcantel was a member of Our Lady Help of Christians Church
28	for sixty-eight years and served the church on the parish council, the school board, and as
29	legal counsel for many years; and
30	WHEREAS, he was also a 4th Degree Member of the Knights of Columbus; and

WHEREAS, Judge Marcantel's happiest times were spent at his camp, Cardinal Cove, near Lake Arthur on the Mermentau River, surrounded by family and friends; and

WHEREAS, his passion for hunting and fishing were legendary and every avid hunter coveted an invitation to his houseboat in the deep marsh for a shot at the legal limit; and

6 WHEREAS, his dogs, Buck, Miss Bee, and Rex were part of the family as well; and 7 WHEREAS, he is survived by his daughter, Nancy Tabb Marcantel; three sons, 8 David Emile Marcantel, Gregory Norman Marcantel, and Peter C. Marcantel; ten 9 grandchildren: Pierre, Natalie, Joel, Andrew, Anna, and Noel Marcantel; Chelsea 10 Marcantel-Polaski; Sister Protectrice de la Foi; Shannon Rougeau Greer; step-grandson Paul 11 Rougeau; one great-grandchild, Tristan Greer; and numerous much-loved nieces and 12 nephews on both the Marcantel and deGravelles sides who considered him their patriarch 13 and mentor; and

WHEREAS, he was preceded in death by his parents, Emile and Florence Reed
Marcantel; his wife, Martha deGravelles Marcantel; his second wife, Nancy Ellisor
Marcantel; and his infant daughter, Kathryn; and

WHEREAS, with the death of Judge Bernard Marcantel, Louisiana has lost one of
its finest sons, a quintessential southern gentleman who loved his community and whose
accomplishments have left an indelible mark upon his community, state, and nation; and

- WHEREAS, his death has left a substantial void in the Jennings community and a sense of loss in the citizens whose lives he touched, and his memory shall live forever in the minds and hearts of all those who knew and loved this remarkable man.
- THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby express sincere and heartfelt condolences upon the death of Judge Bernard Marcantel, records for posterity his outstanding achievements, and extends enduring appreciation for the tremendous pride and honor that he will forever bring to the Jennings community, the state of Louisiana, and the United States of America.
