Establishes the Occupational Board Compliance Act

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the Occupational Licensing Review Commission. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that the commission shall consist of the governor, the secretary of state, the state treasurer, the commissioner of insurance, and the commissioner of agriculture or respective designees. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that the Commission shall be responsible for the active supervision of occupational licensing boards.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

The LFO anticipates that this measure will result in an increased workload for the Office of the Governor. Any expenditures resulting from this proposed legislation will depend on staff time needed to provide research assistance and clerical support to the Occupational Licensing Review Commission. The Office of the Governor anticipates \$54,000 in SGF expenditures associated with hiring an administrative assistant to provide clerical support for the commission. The LFO cannot corroborate that the requirements of the proposed law will create a workload level sufficient to require a full time employee. To the extent that existing, part time, or temporary employees are used, personnel cost will be mitigated.

NOTE: The LFO estimates that 49 licensing organizations will fall under the purview of the commission.

Office of the Governor

The bill provides that the Office of the Governor shall be responsible for providing research assistance and clerical support to the commission. The Office of the Governor indicates that it does not have capacity within its existing staff to provide this support and anticipates that it would incur salary and operating expenses associated with hiring an administrative assistant to provide support to the commission.

Estimated FY 19 costs for the Office of the Governor

\$49,000 Salary and benefits for an administrative assistant

\$ 2,000 Operating expenses

\$ 3,000 One time costs (office furniture, computer)

\$54,000 Estimated FY 19 cost

The Secretary of State, Treasurer's Office, Department of Insurance, and Department of Agriculture do not anticipate that they will incur additional cost as a result of this measure.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
