<u>Prior law</u> provided that the Louisiana Board of Medical Examiners (LSBME) shall certify as a licensed acupuncturist any of the following:

- (1) An individual who has graduated from an acupuncture school or college accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine.
- (2) An individual who has successfully passed the certification examination given by the National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine (NCCAOM).

<u>New law</u> changes <u>prior law</u> to provide that the LSBME shall certify as a licensed acupuncturist an individual who meets both of the following:

- (1) Holds active status with the National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine.
- (2) Has successfully passed the certification examination, including the Biomedicine portion of the examination, given by the National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine.

<u>Prior law</u> required a licensed acupuncturist to establish and maintain a relationship with a physician who operates a physical practice location in the state.

New law repeals the duty to maintain a relationship with a physician.

Effective August 1, 2018.
