8 **(5) The updates to the State Uniform Construction Code shall not**  
 9 **become effective until approved by the legislature by concurrent resolution. If**  
 10 **the legislature fails to adopt the updates to the State Uniform Construction**  
 11 **Code, the most recently approved State Uniform Construction Code shall**  
 12 **remain in effect until the legislature approves updates to the State Uniform**  
 13 **Construction Code in accordance with this Paragraph.**

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#### DIGEST

SB 20 Original

2019 Regular Session

Present law provides for a State Uniform Construction Code (code) and requires the La. State Uniform Construction Code Council (council) to review and update the code no later than five years from the date of publication of the code.

Present law requires the council to submit the updated code to the House Committee on Commerce and the Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and International Affairs for oversight and approval and requires the council to provide all legislative members with a summary of the major proposed changes.

Proposed law retains present law and requires that submission to the committees be no later than 10 days prior to the prefiling deadline for bills for a regular session.

Proposed law provides that the updates to the code will not become effective until approved by the legislature by concurrent resolution.

Proposed law provides that if the legislature fails to adopt updates to the code, the most recently approved code shall remain in effect until such approval.

Effective August 1, 2019.
