LAW ENFORCE/OFFICERS: Provides relative to training for law enforcement officers and first responders with regard to Alzheimer's and other dementia-related conditions

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:2405.8(G) and to enact R.S. 40:1133.1(D) and 2405.8(H),
3	relative to peace officer training; to provide for emergency medical personnel
4	training; to create a dementia training program; to require the reporting of neglect
5	and abuse; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 40:2405.8(G) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
8	40:1133.1(D) and 40:2405.8(H) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§1133.1. Emergency medical personnel training; licensure
10	* * *
11	D. The bureau shall create a dementia training program in cooperation with
12	the Department of Health. Each emergency medical personnel shall complete the
13	dementia training program. This training shall include instructions on identifying
14	and interacting with people with Alzheimer's or other dementia, best practices on
15	emergency medical care for them, and identifying signs of elder abuse as part of the
16	basic training and continuing education.
17	(1) The initial training and continuing education classes shall cover all of the
18	following:
19	(a) Dementia, psychiatric, and behavioral symptoms, and common medical
20	emergencies experienced by people living with dementia.

Abstract: Provides for the training of peace officers and first responders with respect to interacting with Alzheimer's and dementia patients.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the bureau of emergency medical services and the Council on Peace Officer Standards and Training to create a dementia training program in cooperation with the Department of Health. Provides for the creation of an initial training program and updates to the continuing education program.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for instructions on how to identify and interact with people who have been diagnosed with Alzheimer's or dementia.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires newly hired emergency medical service professionals to complete the initial training program within six months and requires all emergency medical service professionals to report any and all abuse or neglect.
