EVIDENCE: Provides relative to the admissibility of evidence regarding worker's compensation claims and payments of benefits

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact Code of Evidence Article 414, relative to the admissibility of 3 evidence; to provide relative to the admissibility of evidence of certain worker's 4 compensation claims or payments of benefits; and to provide for related matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 6 Section 1. Code of Evidence Article 414 is hereby amended and reenacted to read 7 as follows: 8 Art. 414. Worker's compensation payments 9 Evidence of the nature and extent of a worker's compensation claim or of 10 payment of past or future worker's compensation benefits shall not may be 11 admissible to a jury, directly or indirectly, in any civil proceeding with respect to a 12 claim for damages relative to the same injury for which the worker's compensation 13 benefits are claimed or paid. Such evidence shall be admissible and presented to the 14 judge only.

Abstract: Authorizes evidence of certain worker's compensation claims or payments of benefits to be admissible to a jury.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits evidence of the nature and extent of a worker's compensation claim or of payment of benefits from being admissible to a jury in any civil proceeding, but provides that such evidence shall be admissible and presented to the judge only.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that such evidence may be admissible to a jury and shall be admissible and presented to the judge.
