HOUSE BILL NO. 2

BY REPRESENTATIVE ABRAMSON

CAPITAL OUTLAY: Provides for the comprehensive Capital Outlay budget

1 AN ACT

2 To provide with respect to the capital outlay budget and the capital outlay program for state  
3 government, state institutions, and other public entities; to provide for the designation  
4 of projects and improvements; to provide for the financing thereof making  
5 appropriations from certain sources; and to provide for related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. The following sums or so much thereof as may be necessary are hereby  
8 appropriated out of any monies in the state treasury from the sources specified, from federal  
9 funds and self-generated revenues belonging to the state of Louisiana and/or collected by  
10 boards, commissions, departments, and agencies thereof, all for making capital outlay and  
11 for the purposes and in the amounts specified herein for the Fiscal Year commencing July  
12 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, subject to the conditions thereafter provided:

13 A project with funding payable from General Obligation Bonds Priority 1 indicates that  
14 the funding for the project includes the reauthorization of funding which was previously  
15 granted as a line of credit by the State Bond Commission in Fiscal Year 2018-2019. As used  
16 in this Section, the term "general obligation bonds" means state general obligation bonds or  
17 other evidences of indebtedness payable from the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. The  
18 amount set forth in this Section opposite each project, or so much thereof as may be  
19 necessary, is hereby appropriated and payable from the source of funding indicated;  
20 provided, however, amounts appropriated and payable from federal funds may be

1 encumbered or expended only to the extent such amounts shall have been committed or  
2 received. Pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 39:82, funds for planning, acquisition,  
3 construction, and major repair projects appropriated by this Act may be retained until  
4 completion of the project, even if no bona fide liability exists on the last day of the fiscal  
5 year.

6 This Act shall constitute the comprehensive state capital outlay budget for the 2019-2020  
7 Fiscal Year. Projects set forth which are payable from the proceeds available from the sale  
8 of general obligation bonds shall have the priorities as indicated. The Request for Line of  
9 Credit form used by the attorney general and Bond Counsel in evaluating Louisiana  
10 Constitutional, Internal Revenue Code, and applicable income tax regulations shall be filed  
11 with the commissioner of administration, State Bond Commission, and state attorney  
12 general. No general obligation bond cash lines of credit shall be granted to fund any lower  
13 priority project prior to the granting of general obligation bond cash lines of credit to fund  
14 all higher priority projects (the "general rule"), except as hereinafter provided. This  
15 prohibition against funding a lower priority project shall not apply upon a showing of an  
16 impossibility or impracticality either to proceed with all unfunded higher priority projects  
17 or to proceed with the funding of such projects or any part thereof through the issuance of  
18 general obligation bonds for any reason. Such showing shall be stated in reasonable detail  
19 in a certificate or certificates signed by the state agency responsible for administering the  
20 funding, and filed with the commissioner of administration and the State Bond Commission  
21 (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission"). Upon a determination by the Commission  
22 that proceeding with such a project or the funding thereof through the issuance of general  
23 obligation bonds is impractical or impossible, the Commission may then proceed with the  
24 sale of general obligation bonds or the granting of cash lines of credit without regard to the  
25 priority of the unfunded projects determined to be impossible or impractical.

26 Upon recommendation by the state agency responsible for administering the funding, if  
27 it is determined at any time that proceeding with the project or with the funding thereof is  
28 no longer impossible or impractical, the State Bond Commission may rescind the certificate  
29 of impossibility or impracticality and may proceed with the project or with the issuance of  
30 general obligation bonds or the granting of cash lines of credit to fund the project.

1 Alternatively, the Interim Emergency Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), upon  
2 reviewing certificates as described above and determining that proceeding with such project  
3 or the funding thereof through the issuance of general obligation bonds is impossible or  
4 impractical, may designate a lower priority for such project. The Board's determination and  
5 lower priority designation shall be submitted to the members of the legislature for their  
6 approval in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 3-B of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the  
7 Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950. In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 3-B of  
8 Subtitle I of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, whenever at the written  
9 request of the appropriate legislators and agency, the Board determines that an adjustment  
10 to a project description originally set forth in such capital budget adopted by the legislature  
11 for a current fiscal year is necessary to correct a mistake in a project description, clarify a  
12 description, change the scope of a description, or make any other adjustment the Board  
13 deems necessary to implement the purpose of the project, such adjustment shall become  
14 effective only upon the approval by majority vote of the elected members of each house of  
15 the legislature in the manner provided for in Chapter 3-B of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the  
16 Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950.

17 If such approval is granted, notification by the chair or secretary of the Board of the  
18 results of the balloting shall be transmitted to the State Bond Commission, which may then  
19 proceed with the sale of general obligation bonds or the granting of cash lines of credit for  
20 each change approved upon request of the commissioner of administration in accordance  
21 with the general rule.

22 With respect to Priorities 1 through 5, a lower priority project may be moved to a higher  
23 priority only upon a showing of an emergency or other cause not reasonably anticipated by  
24 the legislature, which shall be stated in reasonable detail in a certificate signed by the head  
25 of the appropriate department, political subdivision, or agency and filed with the  
26 commissioner of administration and the Board. Upon a determination by the Board that such  
27 project should be moved to a higher priority because of an emergency or other cause not  
28 reasonably anticipated by the legislature, the Board shall designate a higher priority to the  
29 project. The matter then shall be submitted to and be subject to the same approval by the  
30 members of the legislature in the manner previously indicated in this Section. If such

1 approval is granted, notification by the chair or secretary of the board of the change of  
2 priority shall be transmitted to the State Bond Commission, which then upon request of the  
3 commissioner of administration, may proceed with the sale of general obligation bonds or  
4 the granting of cash lines of credit in accordance with the general rule. As to projects within  
5 a priority, the State Bond Commission acting on requests submitted by the commissioner of  
6 administration shall determine when such project, or phases thereof, shall be funded. In  
7 making such determination, the State Bond Commission shall consider the amount of  
8 proceeds of general obligation bonds to be made available in light of money and capital  
9 market conditions; the expenditure requirements of the project; the time required for  
10 architectural plans and drawings, public bidding, and site acquisition and preparation;  
11 availability of receipt of federal monies; litigation affecting the undertaking or completion  
12 of a project; federal tax laws and regulations regarding the sale of municipal bonds; and  
13 other items of a similar nature bearing upon the possibility or the necessity to commence a  
14 project or any particular phase thereof.

15 Any other provision of this Act to the contrary notwithstanding, projects described in  
16 Priority 5 of this Act shall not be moved to a higher priority except upon one of the  
17 following conditions: (1) Funding is necessary to complete or additionally fund a project  
18 located elsewhere in the Capital Outlay Act. Determination of such condition shall be made  
19 by the head of the appropriate department or agency by means of a certificate to that effect  
20 filed with the Interim Emergency Board, who shall, by mail ballot, request approval of such  
21 change and if approved by a majority of each house of the legislature it shall be funded, or  
22 (2) unless required by an emergency or other cause not reasonably anticipated by the  
23 legislature, to be in accordance with procedures set forth in this Section. However, the State  
24 Bond Commission may authorize a non-cash line of credit for any project in Priority 5 which  
25 represents that portion of construction contracts which were let during a previous fiscal year,  
26 or construction contracts which will be let during the current fiscal year, but which will not  
27 require cash expenditures during the year. Such non-cash lines of credit, when combined  
28 with previously sold bonds or with higher priority bonds or lines of credit, or with funds  
29 appropriated from other sources, will provide sufficient appropriated funds to award

1 equipment or construction contracts. Contracts shall not be awarded without approval of the  
2 division of administration.

3       Upon approval by the State Bond Commission, and subject to compliance with its  
4 policies and procedures and the procedures set forth herein, a line of credit providing for the  
5 use of funds in anticipation of the sale of general obligation bonds may be granted to the  
6 appropriate administering agency or department from the Comprehensive Capital Outlay  
7 Escrow Account, or if there is not a sufficient amount available in such account, from other  
8 available state cash in the state treasury, for capital improvement projects for which bond  
9 proceeds are appropriated by a current capital budget, prior to the actual issuance of bonds  
10 for such projects, unless the attorney general advises that an impediment exists to the valid  
11 issuance of the bonds on the date such line of credit is granted.

12       All bonds that are to be repaid, in whole or in part, by revenues generated by the project  
13 shall be designated as "Reimbursement Bonds". The State Bond Commission shall enter  
14 into such agreements as are necessary to provide that the agency or subdivision, whose  
15 project is reimbursable, shall pay the bond debt costs into the Bond Security and Redemption  
16 Fund. Such costs may be paid annually or at the end of the term of the bonds issued as  
17 determined by the State Bond Commission.

18       Priority 1 general obligation bond funding shall be limited to:

19       (1) Projects and amounts which were previously authorized by Act 29 of the 2018  
20 Regular Session of the Legislature; and which were granted cash lines of credit by the State  
21 Bond Commission. The bonds to fund these projects were not sold in Fiscal Year 2018-  
22 2019.

23       (2) The reauthorization of the portion of the outstanding Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Priority  
24 5 Non-Cash Lines of Credit for projects which will require cash expenditures in Fiscal Year  
25 2019-2020 and therefore must be converted to Cash Lines of Credit in Fiscal Year 2019-  
26 2020.

27       (3) Commitments made in the Higher Education Desegregation Settlement Agreement.

28       Priority 2 general obligation bond projects are for the completion of plans and  
29 specifications, land acquisition, site preparation, or for construction which will begin during

1 the fiscal year. It is presently anticipated that the listed projects will require the sale of  
2 bonds or extension of lines of credit during the fiscal year after adoption of this Act.

3 Priority 3 general obligation bond projects are for the preparation of plans and  
4 specifications, land acquisition, site preparation, or for construction and shall be limited to  
5 funding for the portion of construction contracts which will not require cash expenditures  
6 during the fiscal year. The projects in this category shall be considered future year projects  
7 in the state's five-year capital outlay plan. It is presently anticipated that the listed projects  
8 will not require the sale of bonds or extension of lines of credit during the fiscal year.

9 Priority 4 general obligation bond projects are for the preparation of plans and  
10 specifications, land acquisition, site preparation, or for construction and shall be limited to  
11 funding for the portion of construction contracts which will not require cash expenditures  
12 during the fiscal year. The projects in this category shall be considered future year projects  
13 in the state's five-year capital outlay plan. It is presently anticipated that the listed projects  
14 will not require the sale of bonds or extension of lines of credit during the fiscal year.

15 Priority 5 general obligation bond funding shall be limited to funding for the portion of  
16 construction contracts which will not require cash expenditures during the fiscal year. These  
17 funds, when combined with previously sold bonds or with higher priority bonds on lines of  
18 credit, or with funds appropriated from other sources, will provide sufficient appropriated  
19 funds to award contracts. Non-cash lines of credit shall be required prior to the award of  
20 these contracts.

21 In accordance with the cash management plan adopted pursuant to R.S. 48:251(D) and  
22 the provisions of Act 161 of the 1998 First Extraordinary Session, the Department of  
23 Transportation and Development is authorized to enter into contracts or agreements for  
24 projects approved pursuant to the Highway Priority Program, Airport Construction and  
25 Development Priority Program, Port Construction and Development Priority Program, and  
26 Statewide Flood Control Program for projects bid and awarded, authorized, or commenced  
27 during the fiscal year which do not require cash expenditures for the full contract or  
28 agreement amount.

12 budget and approved by the legislature through inclusion in the General Appropriation Act  
13 shall be considered waived upon the inclusion of such equipment in this Act. Projects  
14 contained in this Act may, at the direction of the division of administration and with the  
15 approval of the State Bond Commission, alternatively be funded through financing programs  
16 heretofore or hereafter provided by a public trust and public corporation duly organized  
17 pursuant to R.S. 9:2341 et seq., having for its beneficiary the state and the Louisiana Local  
18 Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development Authority, pursuant to  
19 R.S. 33:4548.1 et seq.

20 Section 4. If at any time during the Fiscal Year 2019-2020, the governor should  
21 find, or the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget or the commissioner of  
22 administration should report to the governor, that the receipts of the treasury are falling short  
23 or appear likely to fall short of the revenue estimates for the fiscal year and that a cash  
24 deficit is likely to be incurred, the governor shall take such steps as deemed necessary to  
25 prevent the occurrence of a cash deficit. In the event that a capital outlay project funded in  
26 this Act falls under an agency which is abolished or for which funds are not appropriated in  
27 the 2019-2020 General Appropriation Act, then the funds appropriated in this Act for such  
28 capital outlay projects shall not be expended unless deemed necessary by the governor to  
29 protect life or property. In the event that legislation is enacted which transfers facilities or  
30 programs for which projects are funded in this Act, on behalf of one agency, institution,

1 department, or management board to another agency, institution, department, or management  
2 board, then the projects in this Act shall be deemed transferred also.

3           Section 5. All monies appropriated by this Act and any applicable funds of a  
4 prior capital outlay budget act adopted by the legislature shall be deposited by the state  
5 treasurer in the Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account, established by this Section,  
6 in the state treasury. In accordance with R.S. 36:764, no later than sixty days following the  
7 end of each quarter, the state treasurer shall report to the Joint Legislative Committee on the  
8 Budget and the commissioner of administration, all funds contained in the Miscellaneous  
9 Fund of the Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account. Notwithstanding any  
10 provisions contained herein or other law to the contrary, any original issue premium or  
11 accrued interest proceeds received pursuant to the sale of general obligation bonds shall  
12 remain on deposit to the credit of the Bond Security and Redemption Fund until such time  
13 as they may be utilized in accordance with U.S. Department of the Treasury Regulations  
14 promulgated pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. All such monies shall be  
15 administered according to the particular act pertaining to the fiscal year in which such  
16 monies were appropriated. If it is determined by the director of the office of facility  
17 planning and control, division of administration, that the funds appropriated by this Act or  
18 any prior capital outlay budget act are not sufficient to complete the projects contained in  
19 any capital outlay budget act, through unavoidable deficiencies in appropriation, including  
20 administrative and legal requirements, the commissioner of administration, subject to  
21 approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, may direct the use of interest  
22 earned from the investment of general obligation bond or note proceeds in the  
23 Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account, not to exceed an aggregate of five million  
24 dollars in any one fiscal year, for the purpose of completing the projects contained in any  
25 capital outlay budget act and such money shall be deemed appropriated in specific amounts  
26 necessary for such purpose. All appropriations in this Act which are made as additions to  
27 funds for previously authorized projects shall be included, for accounting purposes, in the  
28 account of the previously authorized projects. If it is determined by the director of the office  
29 of facility planning and control, division of administration, that it is cost effective and  
30 practical to combine individual appropriations, the commissioner of administration, subject

1 to the approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, may direct that two or  
2 more appropriations or parts thereof may be combined into a single project for accounting  
3 and audit purposes. The commissioner of administration may direct that funding in the  
4 various statewide and/or multiple parish projects for improvements for state facilities may  
5 be transferred to any project, in this Act or any previous Capital Outlay Act, which require  
6 supplemental funding for improvements for state facilities which qualify for funding through  
7 the various statewide and/or multiple parish projects for improvements for state facilities.  
8 The office of facility planning and control, division of administration is authorized to receive  
9 settlements and vendor rebates not in excess of \$50,000 unless approved by the Joint  
10 Legislative Committee on the Budget, and to add those receipts to the funding for projects  
11 in this Act or any previous Capital Outlay Act for which project funds are received. The  
12 office of facility planning and control, division of administration is authorized to receive  
13 insurance payments and are hereby authorized to immediately repair facilities that suffer  
14 insurance losses without those projects being included in the Act and shall report to the Joint  
15 Legislative Committee on the Budget any expenditures from insurance funds received  
16 pursuant to this section. A portion, as determined by the commissioner of administration and  
17 not to exceed one percent (1%), of the funding for projects which qualify for the Percent for  
18 Art Program and not to exceed \$450,000 for an individual, qualifying project, may be  
19 transferred from the qualifying project budgets, to the Department of Culture, Recreation and  
20 Tourism for costs of acquiring art and administering the program. For all Percent for Art  
21 Program projects in this or any previous capital outlay, up to ten percent (10%) of the  
22 aforementioned one percent (1%) may be used for the costs of administering the projects.

23           Section 6. Prior to March 1, 2020, the commissioner of administration shall  
24 submit to the Joint Legislative Committee on Capital Outlay a list of projects that are  
25 completed and the cash balances remaining in each project.

26           Section 7. The commissioner of administration, with the approval of the Joint  
27 Legislative Committee on the Budget, is authorized to supplement or substitute the  
28 appropriations specified in this or previous capital outlay acts with any federal or other funds  
29 which are or may become available and such funds shall be deemed appropriated in specific  
30 amounts necessary for the purposes of this Act. Any funds received by the State Bond

1 Commission as a result of a prepayment of reimbursement contracts as authorized by law  
2 and the policy and procedure for reimbursement contracts of the Department of Treasury,  
3 office of State Bond Commission, shall be deposited as set forth in such policy and  
4 procedure and shall be deemed available and appropriated in specific amounts necessary for  
5 the purposes of this Act pursuant to the procedure set forth in this section.

6 Section 8A. All of the funds herein appropriated, except for appropriations made  
7 to the Department of Military Affairs, the Legislature, the Louisiana Stadium and Exposition  
8 District, the Department of Economic Development, the Coastal Protection and Restoration  
9 Authority, the Division of Administration for Supplemental State Funds for Local  
10 Government Assistance Program, the Division of Administration for the Community Water  
11 Enrichment Program or the Department of Transportation and Development, shall be  
12 considered as having been appropriated directly to the Office of Facility Planning and  
13 Control, Division of Administration, and all projects herein authorized and funded shall be  
14 subject to the provisions of R.S. 39:101 through 128. All cooperative endeavor agreements  
15 for non-state entities shall be prepared by the office of facility planning and control and the  
16 commissioner of administration is hereby authorized and directed to effectuate any necessary  
17 transfer of funds from the Department of Justice to the office of facility planning and control  
18 in order to accomplish this purpose.

19 (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this act to the contrary or any other  
20 provision of law, the appropriations made for the Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District  
21 shall be appropriated directly to the Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District, and are  
22 public purposes pursuant to the provisions of Article VII, Section 14 of the Constitution of  
23 Louisiana primarily for economic development, including the generation of tax revenue,  
24 creation of jobs, and the generation of tourism, and may be used to reimburse any  
25 expenditure made prior to the granting of a line of credit or the sale of bonds by the State  
26 Bond Commission, determination by the State Treasurer that cash funding has been  
27 deposited in the Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account for the project.

28 (2) Further, with respect to appropriations to the Louisiana Stadium and  
29 Exposition District for the TPC Louisiana, Planning and Construction project, the Louisiana  
30 Stadium and Exposition District shall be permitted to use alternative competitive

1 procurement and delivery methods for the award of any contracts to be funded through such  
2 appropriation.

3 (3) The Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District shall have the authority to  
4 directly appoint a design professional from a list of a minimum of three architectural firms  
5 or joint ventures with professional sports facility design experience acceptable to the  
6 Commissioner of Administration and shall be exempt from other state requirements for  
7 selection of designers. The design professional fee shall be in accordance with state  
8 guidelines administered by the Office of Facility Planning and Control, Division of  
9 Administration.

10 Section 8B.(1)(a) All of the funds appropriated in the Capital Outlay Act under  
11 the name of non-state entities shall be administered by the Office of Facility Planning and  
12 Control, Division of Administration, under cooperative endeavor agreements. Cooperative  
13 endeavor agreements entered into pursuant to this Act, and approved by the Commissioner  
14 of Administration or his designee, or the Secretary of the Department of Transportation and  
15 Development for projects appropriated to or administered by the Department of  
16 Transportation and Development, shall not be required to be submitted to the Division of  
17 Administration, Office of Contractual Review.

18 (b) Further, for all projects in the Capital Outlay Act or a previous Capital  
19 Outlay Act which are appropriated to the Office of Facility Planning and Control, Division  
20 of Administration, including those administered by cooperative endeavor agreements, up to  
21 six percent of each line-item may be used for costs of administering the projects.

22 (c) For all projects in Capital Outlay Act or a previous Capital Outlay Act  
23 appropriated to the Department of Transportation and Development, up to six percent of  
24 each line-item may be used for costs of administering the projects, or for field  
25 engineering/construction supervision.

26 (2) Notwithstanding anything in this Act, or a previous Capital Outlay Act, the  
27 Office of Facility Planning and Control may enter into a cooperative endeavor agreement  
28 with the Archdiocese of New Orleans and Jefferson Parish for the Preservation and  
29 Restoration of Historic Structure for Hope Haven/Madonna Manor Campus, Planning and  
30 Construction project.

1           (3) Notwithstanding anything in this Act, or a previous Capital Outlay Act, the  
2 Office of Facility Planning and Control may enter into a cooperative endeavor agreement  
3 with Terrebonne Parish Recreation Districts Two and Three and Terrebonne Parish for the  
4 Terrebonne Sports Complex Phase I, Infrastructure Improvements, Acquisition, Planning  
5 and Construction project.

6           Section 8C. Line-item general obligation bond projects appropriated to the  
7 Department of Transportation and Development in the Capital Outlay Act or a previous  
8 Capital Outlay Act shall be authorized to draw Transportation Trust Funds from the  
9 Highway Program appropriation, for supplemental funding on overruns in excess of the  
10 original estimated project cost as determined by the Department of Transportation and  
11 Development, provided however that said projects are in the state or federal highway system  
12 and in the priority program, and the overrun is less than \$50,000. Any such overrun of  
13 \$50,000 or more must be approved by the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.

14           Section 8D. All ports, levee districts and other non-state entities must have a  
15 fully executed cooperative endeavor agreement, from the Office of Facility Planning and  
16 Control, Department of Transportation and Development, or the State Treasurer, whichever  
17 is appropriate, before entering into any contracts which obligate state funding and must  
18 follow all laws pertaining to public bidding. If a port, levee district or other non-state entity  
19 enters into a contract prior to receipt of funding, or prior to execution of a cooperative  
20 endeavor agreement, then payments under such contracts are prohibited from capital outlay  
21 appropriations, and are the sole responsibility of the port, levee district, or other non-state  
22 entity.

23           Section 8E. Pursuant to R.S. 39:122(B)(2), funds to be reimbursed by the state  
24 which a non-state entity attempts to obligate prior to the receipt of funding shall not be  
25 eligible for reimbursement or payment by the state; however,

26           (1) Notwithstanding anything in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to the  
27 contrary, contracts may be entered into for the City of New Orleans, Eastern New Orleans  
28 Hospital and Medical Office Building, Real Estate Acquisition, Planning, Design,  
29 Construction, Renovation and Equipment project prior to receipt of funding and prior to  
30 execution of the cooperative endeavor agreement.

1           (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, or the Capital Outlay Act,  
2 or any other capital outlay act, contracts may be entered into for the Port of South Louisiana,  
3 Globalplex Rail Siding; Globalplex Terminal Building #71 Upgrade, Planning and  
4 Construction and/or Administration Building (also known as the Business Development  
5 Center) projects prior to receipt of funding and prior to execution of a cooperative endeavor  
6 agreement.

7           (3) Notwithstanding anything in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to the  
8 contrary or any other provision of law, contracts may be entered into for the Greater Baton  
9 Rouge Port Commission Inland Rivers Marine Terminal Dock and Access Roadway  
10 Construction Project, Planning and Construction Project prior to receipt of funding and prior  
11 to the execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement.

12           (4) Notwithstanding anything in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to the  
13 contrary or any other provision of law, contracts may be entered into for the Outpatient  
14 Clinics in Rapides Parish, Planning and Construction project for the Division of  
15 Administration prior to the execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement.

16           (5) Notwithstanding anything in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to the  
17 contrary or any other provision of law, contracts may be entered into for the Mississippi  
18 River Levee Raising, Arkansas to Old River project prior to receipt of funding, and the State  
19 is authorized to financially participate in obligations created by such contracts.

20           (6) Notwithstanding anything in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to the  
21 contrary or any other provision of law, contracts may be entered into for the Old McKinley  
22 High School Community Center on Thomas Delpit Drive in the City of Baton Rouge,  
23 Kitchen and Building Renovations, Repairs and Upgrades Including Elevator Repair Project  
24 prior to receipt of funding and prior to the execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement,  
25 and unless the Commissioner of Administration is advised by bond counsel to the state that  
26 such may violate federal tax law, the appropriation may be used to reimburse any  
27 expenditure made prior to the granting of a line of credit or the sale of bonds by the State  
28 Bond Commission.

29           (7) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Capital Outlay Act, or any  
30 previous Capital Outlay Act to the contrary, or any other provision of law, contracts may be

1 entered into for the Broussard, Reconstruct South Bernard Road from La. Hwy. 182 to US  
2 Highway 90, Planning and Construction in Lafayette Parish project, prior to execution of the  
3 cooperative endeavor agreement and/or receipt of funding, and the state is authorized to  
4 financially participate in obligations created by such contracts, and the right-of-ways and  
5 servitudes acquired by the City are considered eligible expenses and may be used as local  
6 match for the project.

7 (8) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Capital Outlay Act, or any  
8 previous Capital Outlay Act to the contrary, or any other provision of law, contracts may be  
9 entered into for the Westwego Fire Station, Planning and Construction in Jefferson Parish  
10 project, prior to receipt of funding and the state is authorized to financially participate in  
11 obligations created for such project.

12 Section 8F. Pursuant to R.S. 39:112(E)(2), non-state entity projects shall require  
13 a match of not less than twenty-five percent of the total requested amount of funding;  
14 however,

15 (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 39:112(E)(2), the project for  
16 Independence, Independence Area Community Pavilion, Planning and Construction, shall  
17 be exempt from all local match requirements.

18 (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to  
19 the contrary, any other provisions of law, or the provisions of R.S. 39:112(E)(2), the project  
20 for Eden House, New Facility, Acquisition, Planning and Construction, shall be exempt from  
21 all local match requirements.

22 (3) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the Capital Outlay Act, any  
23 other provision of law, or the provisions of R.S. 39:112(E)(2) to the contrary, the project for  
24 Lockport Street Improvements, Planning and Construction, shall be exempt from all local  
25 match requirements.

26 (4) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, any prior Capital Outlay Act,  
27 any other provision of law, or the provisions of R.S. 39:112(E)(2) to the contrary, the project  
28 for the Village of Doyline Wastewater Treatment Facility shall be exempt from all local  
29 match requirements.

1           Section 8G. Pursuant to R.S. 39:102, each capital outlay budget request  
2 submitted as required by R.S. 39:101 shall include a detailed project description and  
3 justification for each new project requested; however,

4           (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act  
5 to the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriations made in the  
6 Capital Outlay Act or any other Capital Outlay Act for the St. Mary Parish Plantation Pump  
7 Station Replacement project shall be deemed to include repair, equipment, rehabilitation and  
8 infrastructure improvements at the existing Plantation Pump Station.

9           (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to  
10 the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriations made in this or  
11 any other Capital Outlay Act for the Louisiana 4-H Foundation, Youth Education  
12 Development Camp Windy Wood project, shall be deemed to include planning, construction,  
13 and acquisition.

14           (3) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to  
15 the contrary, or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriations made in the  
16 Capital Outlay Act or any other Capital Outlay Act for the City of New Orleans, Eastern  
17 New Orleans Hospital and Medical Office Building, Real Estate Acquisition, Planning,  
18 Design, Construction, Renovation and Equipment project, the City of New Orleans may  
19 make such capital outlay funds available to the Parish Hospital Service District of the Parish  
20 of Orleans District "A" in furtherance of the District's planning, design, acquisition,  
21 development, renovation, construction, equipment and operation of a hospital and medical  
22 office building in Eastern New Orleans.

23           (4) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to  
24 the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriations made in the  
25 Capital Outlay Act or any other Capital Outlay Act for the Jefferson Parish Bonnabel Canal  
26 Rehabilitation and Bank Stabilization (Veterans Boulevard to West Esplanade), Planning  
27 and Construction project shall be deemed to include steel sheet pile bulkhead, and/or bank  
28 excavation and reshaping, bridge replacement, property acquisition, demolition and  
29 improvements needed to stabilize the canal bank along the Bonnabel Drainage Canal in

1 order to address canal bank failures between Veterans Boulevard and West Esplanade  
2 Avenue.

3 (5) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to  
4 the contrary or any other provision of law, the scope of the appropriations made in this or  
5 any other Capital Outlay Act for the New Orleans West Bank Park Improvements, New  
6 Soccer and Recreational Facilities, and Skateboard Park project and the Norman Playground  
7 Basketball Gym, Planning and Construction project shall be deemed to include the George  
8 W. Carver Playground, Renovations and Upgrades project for the West Bank Park project  
9 and park enhancements for a walking track, basketball, football and baseball fields and a  
10 concession stand for the Norman Playground project.

11 (6) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to  
12 the contrary or any other provision of law, the Parks Municipal Complex, Planning and  
13 Construction project shall include the purchase, construction or renovation of a new facility  
14 in St. Martin Parish.

15 (7) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act to  
16 the contrary or any other provision of law, The Vernon/Fort Polk Thoroughfare Electrical  
17 Power Extension project shall include Utilities Including Generators.

18 (8) Notwithstanding anything in this Act, the Capital Outlay Act, any previous  
19 capital outlay act, or other provision of law to the contrary, the scope of the appropriation  
20 for the Port of South Louisiana Globalplex Terminal Building #71 Upgrade project shall be  
21 deemed to also include similar upgrades for other Globalplex Terminal Buildings.

22 (9) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the Capital Outlay Act, or  
23 any other provision of law to the contrary, the scope of the appropriation for the Department  
24 of Transportation and Development, LA 22 Improvements (LA 16 to Diversion Canal),  
25 Planning and Construction (Livingston) is deemed to also include the overlay of LA 22 from  
26 Head of Island to Chinquapin Bridge.

27 (10) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Act or a previous Capital Outlay  
28 Act, any provision of law, or in any cooperative endeavor agreement between the Office of  
29 Facility Planning and Control and Westwego, the scope of the appropriations in this or any

1 previous Capital Outlay Act for Westwego, The WHARF project shall be deemed to include  
2 site preparation.

3 (11) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Act or the Capital Outlay Act  
4 to the contrary or any other provision of law, the Slip Dredging and Improvements for the  
5 Terrebonne Port Commission Government Multi-Use Complex, Planning and Construction  
6 project shall be deemed to include Houma Navigation Canal Dredging.

7 (12) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or a previous Capital Outlay  
8 Act, any provision of law, or in any cooperative endeavor agreement between the Office of  
9 Facility Planning and Control and the Pontchartrain Levee District, the scope of the  
10 appropriations in this or any previous Capital Outlay Act for the Pontchartrain Levee  
11 District, East St. Charles Urban Flood Control project shall be deemed to include planning,  
12 design, and construction of the East St. Charles Urban Flood Control project, including the  
13 Almedia, St. Rose, and Airport Pump Stations located in the eastern end of the East Bank  
14 of St. Charles Parish.

15 (13) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the Capital Outlay Act, or  
16 any other Capital Outlay Act, the scope of the appropriation for the Department of  
17 Transportation and Development, Jimmie Davis Bridge Rehabilitation and Lighting,  
18 Planning and Construction project in Bossier and Caddo parishes, shall be deemed to include  
19 the planning, design and construction of a new bridge.

20 (14) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or any other Capital Outlay  
21 Act, the scope of the appropriation for the Jean Lafitte, Seafood Pavilion, Planning and  
22 Construction project in Jefferson Parish shall be deemed to include the planning, design, and  
23 construction of a Seafood Market.

24 Section 8H. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay  
25 Act, or in any cooperative endeavor agreement between the Office of Facility Planning and  
26 Control and the City of New Orleans or the Hospital Service District to the contrary, the  
27 Hospital Service District may mortgage or otherwise encumber any and all land, real estate  
28 property, including buildings and equipment, and appurtenances acquired, in whole or part,  
29 with state capital outlay funds provided that bond counsel to the state opines that such

1 mortgage shall not affect the tax-exempt status of the bonds to be issued by the state for the  
2 project.

3           Section 8I. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay  
4 Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, the Parish Road Improvements Project for  
5 Franklin Parish is exempt from the contract limit set forth in R.S. 38:2212.

6           Section 8J. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay  
7 Act to the contrary or any other Act or provision of law, the appropriations made for the  
8 Executive Department for facilities which promote economic development included in the  
9 Repair, Restoration, and Replacement for Hurricanes Katrina and Rita project, and the  
10 Department of Economic Development projects are for public purposes pursuant to the  
11 provisions of Article VII, Section 14 of the Constitution of Louisiana primarily for economic  
12 development, including the generation of tax revenues, creation of jobs, promotion of  
13 tourism, and creation of facilities for charitable, cultural, artistic, educational, social, civic,  
14 research, service, economic development activities, or provide facilities for professional golf  
15 events, pursuant to the terms of cooperative endeavor agreements, including leases and all  
16 expenditures of these appropriations and may be exempted, by the Commissioner of  
17 Administration, from all statutes relative to public bidding, contractual review and the  
18 provisions of R.S. 33:9029.2(D) and in lieu thereof be allowed to use alternative competitive  
19 contracting arrangements where the appropriate administering entity submits documentation  
20 to the Commissioner of Administration substantiating that it is in the best interest of the  
21 citizens of the state, due to economic and/or operational benefits, and the necessity to  
22 complete the projects in a timely manner; and, the appropriate administering entity shall  
23 have the authority to directly appoint the design professional from a list of a minimum of  
24 three design firms or joint ventures with the appropriate specialized facility design  
25 experience submitted to and acceptable to the Commissioner of Administration and shall be  
26 exempt from other state requirements for selection of designers, and may include  
27 expenditures for computers, fixtures, furniture, and other equipment as such is deemed to  
28 be capital outlay in nature, and unless the Commissioner of Administration is advised by  
29 bond counsel to the State that such may violate federal tax law, may be used to reimburse  
30 any expenditure made prior to the granting of a line of credit or the sale of bonds by the State

1 Bond Commission, determination by the State Treasurer that cash funding has been  
2 deposited in the Comprehensive Capital Outlay Escrow Account for the project or the  
3 execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement from the Office of Facility Planning and  
4 Control, and may be used to acquire land or real property, the title to which is held in the  
5 name of an entity exempt from taxation under the provisions of 26 U.S.C. 501(c)(3).

6           Section 8K. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay  
7 Act to the contrary or any other provision of law, all of the funds herein appropriated to the  
8 Department of Economic Development in connection with the Capital Improvements Project  
9 to Meet Economic Development Commitments for which the Department of Economic  
10 Development utilizes a cooperative endeavor agreement to further economic development  
11 as permitted under Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution, including the  
12 generation of tax revenues and creation of jobs, shall be considered as having been  
13 appropriated to the Department of Economic Development, may be used to reimburse any  
14 expenditure made prior to the granting of a line of credit and made prior to the execution of  
15 a cooperative endeavor agreement and shall be administered solely by the Department of  
16 Economic Development pursuant to, in compliance with, and on the terms contained in such  
17 cooperative endeavor agreements.

18           Section 8L. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act or the Capital  
19 Outlay Act or any other provision of law to the contrary, all of the funds herein appropriated  
20 to the Department of Economic Development in connection with projects or programs for  
21 which the Department of Economic Development utilizes a cooperative endeavor agreement  
22 to further economic development as permitted under Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana  
23 Constitution, including the generation of tax revenues and creation of jobs, shall be  
24 considered as having been appropriated to the Department of Economic Development, may  
25 be used to reimburse any expenditure made prior to the granting of a line of credit and made  
26 prior to the execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement and shall be administered solely  
27 by the Department of Economic Development pursuant to, in compliance with, and on the  
28 terms contained in such cooperative endeavor agreements without compliance with any other  
29 law, including, but not limited to, the provisions of R.S. 39:101 through 128. Additionally,  
30 all expenditures of these appropriations may be exempted by the Commissioner of

1 Administration, from all statutes relative to public bidding, contractual review and the  
2 provisions of R.S. 33:9029.2(D).

3 Section 8M.(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act or the Capital  
4 Outlay Act or any other provision of law to the contrary, funds appropriated for the  
5 Economic Development Award Program project for the Office of Business Development  
6 are to be used solely for capital and infrastructure improvements subject to verification by  
7 the Division of Administration, Office of Facility Planning and Control.

8 (2) Eligible expenses for Economic Development Award Program funds may  
9 include documented project expenses beginning on the date of LEDC Board approval of the  
10 project and may be reimbursed upon execution of the cooperative endeavor agreement for  
11 the project.

12 Section 8N. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the  
13 Commissioner of Administration is hereby authorized to take such actions as are necessary,  
14 including using such funds as may be available including those appropriated and available  
15 under this Act or the Capital Outlay Act for professional sports facilities through the  
16 Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District and that are otherwise available, executing on  
17 behalf of the State such documents as are necessary in order to terminate the ground lease  
18 between the State and the PGA and thereby acquiring all leasehold improvements for the  
19 State, extending the management agreement between the State and the PGA, and extending  
20 the sponsorship and presence of the Zurich Classic in the Greater New Orleans area.

21 Section 8O. Notwithstanding anything in this Act, any previous capital outlay  
22 act, or other provision of law to the contrary, monies appropriated herein for the Port of  
23 South Louisiana Globalplex Terminal Building #71 and Other Globalplex Terminal Building  
24 Upgrades, Planning and Construction may be expended for design fees related to the  
25 conveyor system and ancillary equipment that exceed the customary ten percent limitation  
26 on design fee costs.

27 Section 8P. Notwithstanding anything in this Act to the contrary or any other  
28 provision of law, monies appropriated herein for the Juban Road (LA1026) Widening (I-12  
29 to US 190) project may be expended for the installation of sewer lines along the roadway  
30 and pursuant to a cooperative endeavor agreement between the Department of

1 Transportation and Development and Livingston Parish, funds may be provided to  
2 Livingston Parish for that purpose.

3 Section 8Q. The new University Medical Center in New Orleans project in  
4 Orleans Parish shall be exempt from the state's requirements for selection of designers and  
5 the Commissioner of Administration shall have the authority to approve a design  
6 professional selection process. The design professional fee shall be in accordance with state  
7 guidelines administered by the Office of Facility Planning and Control, Division of  
8 Administration.

9 Section 8R.(1) The Division of Administration, Office of Facility Planning and  
10 Control, with approval of the Commissioner of Administration and the Joint Legislative  
11 Committee on the Budget, is authorized to use alternative delivery strategies in  
12 implementing hurricane damage repairs to Southern University at New Orleans, Hazardous  
13 Material Abatement Projects, the City Park Golf Complex Improvements project, the  
14 Health/Human Performance Education Complex, and the Patrick Taylor Hall Renovation  
15 and Expansion project.

16 (2) In addition, with the approval of the Commissioner of Administration and  
17 the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, an alternative delivery strategy may be used  
18 in the implementation of the Louisiana Children's Museum, Early Learning Village project.

19 Section 8S.(1) Due to the State's current investment in TPC Louisiana and the  
20 financial support it provides to the PGA TOUR event currently played at said facility, the  
21 funding of the City Park Golf Complex Improvements project described above is  
22 conditioned upon said PGA TOUR event not being played at New Orleans City Park Golf  
23 Complex without the prior agreement of the Commissioner of Administration and the  
24 Chairman of the Jefferson Parish Council.

25 (2) Notwithstanding the foregoing, the City Park Golf Complex may host any  
26 other golf tournament or event, including but not limited to any other PGA-affiliated or  
27 sponsored tournament or event.

28 Section 8T.(1) For all projects administered by the Office of Facility Planning  
29 and Control and payable from proceeds of self-generated revenues, funds shall be remitted  
30 to the Office of Facility Planning and Control for deposit in the state treasury at such time

1 as may be deemed necessary by the Office of Facility Planning and Control in order to cover  
2 the amount of contracts or other project expenses.

3 (2) Notwithstanding any provisions contained herein or any other law to the  
4 contrary, for projects with other means of financing provided to the administering agency  
5 by interagency transfer, the authority to draw these funds shall remain with the user agency.

6 (3) Any revenue bonds appropriated in Section 1 of the Capital Outlay Act shall  
7 not be secured by the full faith and credit of the state.

8 (4) The State Treasurer shall refund to the appropriate source any surplus self-  
9 generated funds, advanced insurance funds received by the Office of Facility Planning and  
10 Control as Interagency Transfer from Office of Risk Management associated with hurricane  
11 damage recovery, and interest earned on these funds, provided the Treasurer's Office is  
12 notified, when these funds are deposited in the state treasury, that the user agency or Office  
13 of Risk Management intends to request a refund of this interest.

14 Section 8U.(1) Notwithstanding anything in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act  
15 to the contrary or any other provision of law, contracts may be entered into for the Tulane  
16 University Tulane River and Coastal Center Project prior to receipt of funding and prior to  
17 the execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement, and the project is exempted from all  
18 statutes relative to public bidding and state procurement and in lieu thereof shall be subject  
19 to federal government qualifications and regulations approved by the Economic  
20 Development Authority.

21 (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Capital Outlay Act or  
22 any other provision of law to the contrary, contracts may be entered into for the City of  
23 Gretna's Lion's Club Conversion to Senior Center project prior to receipt of funding and  
24 prior to execution of a cooperative endeavor agreement and the project is exempted from all  
25 statutes relative to public bidding and contractual review.

26 Section 8V. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the Capital Outlay  
27 Act, or any other provision of law to the contrary, the letting of a contract for construction  
28 of the "Louisiana Construction Center", funded wholly by the Louisiana Licensing Board  
29 for Contractors, shall be exempt from all statutes relative to public bidding and contractual  
30 review.

1           Section 8W. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the Capital Outlay  
2 Act, or any other provision of law to the contrary, the Department of Transportation and  
3 Development shall use \$2,500,000 of general obligation bond funding appropriated for  
4 Department of Transportation and Development, Administration, Highway Program (Up to  
5 \$4,000,000 for Secretary's Emergency Fund) in Act 25 of the 2014 Regular Session of the  
6 Legislature for the Louisiana Highway 92 Overlay, Preservation and Construction  
7 (Lafayette) project.

8           Section 8X. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the Capital Outlay  
9 Act, or any other provision of law to the contrary, \$50,000 of the appropriation for  
10 Department of Natural Resources, Office of the Secretary, Atchafalaya Basin Protection and  
11 Enhancement (Federal Match and Local/Sponsor Match)(Assumption, Avoyelles, Iberia,  
12 Iberville, Pointe Coupee, St. Landry, St. Martin, St. Mary) will be used to fund House  
13 Concurrent Resolution No. 168 of 2011.

14           Section 8Y. Notwithstanding any provisions contained in this Act, the Capital  
15 Outlay Act, or any other provision of law to the contrary, any funds expended by the Parish  
16 of St. Mary for the purpose of securing a federal grant, for the Infrastructure Improvements  
17 and Construction of a Welding Training Center Facility at the Charenton Canal Industrial  
18 Park, shall be eligible for reimbursement from any cash line of credit approved for the  
19 project.

20           Section 8Z. Notwithstanding any provision contained herein or any other  
21 provision of law to the contrary, the Department of Transportation and Development is  
22 authorized to enter into a cooperative endeavor agreement with the City of New Orleans and  
23 the New Orleans Aviation Board for the Landside Roadways at Louis Armstrong  
24 International North Terminal, Planning and Construction in Jefferson Parish. Furthermore  
25 the capital outlay request application for this project submitted by the City of New Orleans  
26 shall govern the scope of the project.

27           Section 8AA. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Capital Outlay Act, or any  
28 previous Capital Outlay Act to the contrary, or any other provision of law, the Department  
29 of Public Safety and Corrections, youth services, office of juvenile justice, may finance the  
30 the Office of Juvenile Justice, Community Based Program, Juvenile Justice Improvements,

1 Planning, Construction, Renovation, Acquisition, and Equipment (Statewide) project through  
2 the issuance of revenue bonds by the Louisiana Correctional Facilities Corporation to be  
3 secured by and payable from State appropriations. The issuance of such revenue bonds shall  
4 require the approval of the State Bond Commission.

5 Section 9. Notwithstanding any provisions contained herein or any other law to the  
6 contrary, the provisions of Chapter 16 of Subtitle III of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised  
7 Statutes of 1950 as amended, shall not apply to architectural and engineering contracts,  
8 administered by the office of facility planning and control, division of administration  
9 pursuant to this or any other capital outlay act.

10 Section 10. All funds appropriated herein to the office of facility planning and  
11 control, division of administration, on behalf of non-state entities, and administered by  
12 cooperative endeavor agreements pursuant to this Act shall be expended within two (2) years  
13 from the date of the issuance of the bonds. The office of facility planning and control,  
14 division of administration, agrees that it will notify the non-state entity of the date the bonds  
15 are issued within three (3) months from the issuance thereof. The non-state entity  
16 understands and agrees that if the funds appropriated herein and administered under  
17 cooperative endeavor agreements pursuant to this Act are not totally expended within two  
18 (2) years from the issuance of the bonds, the office of facility planning and control, division  
19 of administration, can close the project and recommend that the legislature reallocate any  
20 unexpended proceeds to other projects.

21 Section 11. Notwithstanding any provisions contained herein or law to the contrary,  
22 the proceeds of revenue bonds to be utilized to fund certain projects authorized in Section  
23 1 hereof may, in accordance with Article VII, Section 9 of the Louisiana Constitution of  
24 1974, be deposited in special accounts held outside the state treasury in accordance with the  
25 provisions of any bond resolution, indenture, reimbursement contract, or other bond or  
26 financing covenant which provides for the pledge of such funds in connection with the  
27 issuance of revenue bonds. For all projects administered by the office of facility planning  
28 and control, division of administration, authorized in Section 1 hereof which are payable  
29 from the proceeds of revenue bonds, only the office of facility planning and control, division  
30 of administration, will be authorized to requisition funds from the special accounts described

1 immediately above, at such time or times as may be deemed necessary by the office of  
2 facility planning and control, division of administration, in order to cover contract amounts  
3 or other project expenses.

4 Section 12. The governor shall have the power to veto any line-item in this Act.

5 Section 13. Except as otherwise provided herein, no funds shall be expended on any  
6 highway projects on highways within the state highway system as established in R.S. 48:191  
7 under the jurisdiction of the Department of Transportation and Development unless and until  
8 such project is in the Highway Program, R.S. 48:228 through 232, approved by the Joint  
9 Legislative Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works. Pursuant to R.S.  
10 49:214.6.2(B), no integrated coastal protection construction project shall be undertaken with  
11 funds included in this bill except those included in an annual plan finally approved by the  
12 legislature in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 49:214.5.3. No funds appropriated to  
13 the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority in this Act as a contribution for a project  
14 cost-share or otherwise, for the national economic development and national ecosystem  
15 restoration components of the Southwest Coastal Louisiana Study shall be used or provided  
16 for the expropriation of property or use of eminent domain, except where such funds are to  
17 be used to obtain property voluntarily offered for project purposes, where at least seventy-  
18 five percent of the owners have voluntarily offered the property, or where the record or  
19 apparent owners have voluntarily offered the property but do not have clear title.

20 Section 14. The word "statewide" used in place of the specific parish designation for  
21 projects contained in this Act indicates that the project or program is applicable to all sixty-  
22 four parishes in the state. The description of any project in this Act shall be deemed to  
23 include planning, design, master planning, studies, permits, surveys, testing, construction,  
24 land and/or building/improvement acquisition, reconstruction, renovation, repair, right of  
25 way and utilities, site and other improvements, miscellaneous/contingencies, lease hold  
26 improvements ultimately owned by the state or a political subdivision of the state, equipment  
27 and other acquisitions, and any other component of the project if such are included or  
28 indicated in the capital outlay request for such projects required by R. S. 39:101 subject to  
29 the provisions of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes. For new construction or  
30 renovation projects, equipment or other acquisitions, which can reasonably be considered

1 necessary for the facility to be functional, may be deemed to be included in the project, even  
2 if such equipment or other acquisitions are not included or indicated in the project name or  
3 the capital outlay request. When local or federal match is referenced in a project title, but  
4 only a portion of the state appropriation is granted a line of credit or otherwise funded, then  
5 the amount of local or federal match, required to be made available, may be prorated relative  
6 to the amount of state appropriation made available through lines of credit.

7       Section 15. The provisions, items, and projects contained in this Act are severable  
8 and if any provision, item, or project contained herein, or the application of any such  
9 provision, item, or project, is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions,  
10 items, projects, or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid  
11 provision, project, item, or application.

12       Section 16. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, the state  
13 shall not grant cash lines of credit, or authorize or issue general obligation bonds in a  
14 principal amount in excess of \$837,205,000 for Fiscal Year 2019-2020.

15       Section 17. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of this Act or any contrary  
16 provision of law, no funds appropriated by this Act shall be released or provided to any  
17 recipient of an appropriation made in this Act if, when, and for as long as, the recipient fails  
18 or refuses to comply with the provisions of R.S. 24:513. No recipient shall be considered  
19 to fail or refuse to comply with the provisions of R.S. 24:513 pursuant to this Section during  
20 any extension of time granted by the legislative auditor to the recipient to comply.

21       Section 18. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not  
22 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature  
23 by the governor, as provided in Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If  
24 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become  
25 effective on the day following such approval.
