TAX/GAMING: Levies a state tax on the net gaming proceeds of fantasy sports contests, dedicates the avails of the tax, and authorizes a fee for issuance of certain licenses or permits

9	Section 1. R.S. 27:302(3) and (4) and 306 are hereby enacted to read as follows:

13	(3) "Net gaming proceeds" means the total of all cash and property,		
14	including checks received by an operator or licensee, whether collected or not, from		
15	gaming operations, less the total of all cash paid out as winnings to patrons.		
16	(4) "Operator" or "Licensee" means any person holding or applying for a		
17	gaming license or permit that allows the licensee or permittee to administer, conduct,		
18	control, or manage fantasy sports contests.

<u>§306.</u>	Taxation and fees	

A. There is hereby levied a tax of eight percent upon the net gaming proceeds of fantasy sports contests offered to consumers within this state, which shall be due and payable monthly.

B. The annual fee for a fantasy sports contest license or permit shall be five thousand dollars. This fee is required to be submitted to the division on the anniversary date of the issuance of the license or permit.

C. The division shall collect all fees, fines, and state taxes imposed or assessed under the provisions of this Chapter and under the rules and regulations of the board.

D. All fees, fines, revenues, state taxes, and other monies collected by the division shall be forwarded upon receipt to the state treasurer for immediate deposit into the state treasury. Funds so deposited shall first be credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund in accordance with Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana. After complying with the provisions of the Bond Security and Redemption Fund, the state treasurer shall credit one percent of the net proceeds of fantasy sports contests, not to exceed one hundred thousand dollars, collected from the operator or licensee to the Compulsive and Problem Gaming Fund established by R.S. 28:842. The division shall transfer monthly to the state treasury for deposit into the Compulsive and Problem Gaming Fund the amount of revenues the provider or licensee withheld and remitted in accordance with this Subsection.

After crediting the proceeds to the Compulsive and Problem Gaming Fund, the state treasurer shall each month deposit the remainder of the avails of the taxes collected pursuant to this Section into the Louisiana Early Childhood Education Fund as established in R.S. 17:407.30.

E. An amount shall be allocated to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections and to the Department of Justice, pursuant to legislative appropriation, for regulatory, administrative, investigative, enforcement, legal, and other such expenses as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Chapter and for

1 activities associated with the enforcement of laws and regulations governing fantasy 2 sports contests. F. When the net gaming proceeds for a month are negative because the 3 4 winnings paid to patrons exceed the operator or licensee's total gross gaming 5 proceeds from fantasy sports contests, the operator or licensee shall be allowed to 6 carry over the negative amounts on returns filed for subsequent months. The negative 7 amount of net gaming proceeds may not be carried back to an earlier month. 8 Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2019.

Abstract: Authorizes an 8% state tax on net gaming proceeds from fantasy sports contests and dedicates the avails of the tax to the state general fund and the La. Early Childhood Education Fund.

<u>Present law</u> establishes the "Louisiana Fantasy Sports Contests Act" that authorizes the electors in the state to determine whether fantasy sports contests are permitted in a particular parish.

<u>Present law</u> defines a "fantasy sports contest" to mean any fantasy or simulation sports game or contest played through the internet or mobile device with all of the following elements:

- (1) Participants create a simulation sports team based on the current membership of actual amateur or professional sports organizations.
- (2) All prizes and awards offered to winning participants are established in advance of the game or contest and the value of the prizes is not determined by the number of participants or the amount of fees paid by participants.
- (3) All winning outcomes reflect the relative knowledge and skill of the participant and are determined by accumulated statistical results of the performance of the individuals.
- (4) No winning outcome is based on the score, point-spread, or any performance or performances of any single real-world team or any combination of teams or on a single performance of an individual athlete in any single real-world sporting or other event.

<u>Present law</u> requires the La. Gaming Control Board to adopt rules necessary to implement, administer, and regulate fantasy sports contests in this state if the electors of a parish approved fantasy sports contests in the parish. Upon adoption of rules by the La. Gaming Control Board and the enactment of laws to provide for the licensing, regulation, and taxation of revenue relative to fantasy sports contests, present law provides the following:

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(1) Authorizes fantasy sports contests only in those parishes that approved the proposition to permit fantasy sports contests in the parish.

(2) Provides an exception to crimes in <u>present law</u> for gaming and gambling by computer for fantasy sports contests.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires 1% of the net gaming proceeds of fantasy sports contest gaming not to exceed \$100,000 be credited to the Compulsive and Problem Gaming Fund.

<u>Proposed law</u> levies an 8% tax on the net gaming proceeds of fantasy sports contest gaming conducted in the state and provides for the avails of the tax to go to the La. Early Childhood Education Fund.

Proposed law provides for a \$5,000 fantasy sports contest license or permit fee.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines net gaming proceeds as the total of all cash and property, including checks received by a licensee or operator, whether collected or not from gaming operations, less the total of all cash paid out as winnings to patrons.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the tax levied on fantasy sports contests to be collected by the division in the office of state police, which provides investigatory, regulatory, and enforcement services to the La. Gaming Control Board in the implementation, administration, and enforcement of gaming laws, rules, and regulations.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the legislature to appropriate funds necessary for the Dept. of Public Safety and the Dept. of Justice to administer, regulate, investigate, and enforce laws related to fantasy sports gaming.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires all monies to be collected monthly and further provides that when net gaming proceeds for a month are negative, the licensee or operator shall be allowed to carry over the negative amounts to returns filed for subsequent months.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Ways and Means</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

- 1. Require that 1%, not to exceed \$100,000, of the net proceeds from fantasy sports contests be deposited into the Compulsive and Problem Gaming Fund.
- 2. Authorize the legislature to appropriate funds to the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections and the Dept. of Justice in order to regulate, administer, investigate, and enforce laws related to fantasy sports contests.
