14	involving permanent disability and brought pursuant to the Louisiana
15	Products Liability Act or state law governing product liability actions in

18	Art. 3493. Damage to immovable property; commencement and accrual of
19 20	prescription When damage is caused to immovable property, the one two year
21	prescription commences to run from the day the owner of the immovable
22	acquired, or should have acquired, knowledge of the damage.
23	Section 3. Code of Evidence Article 416 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
24	Art. 416. Wearing of safety belt
25	In any action to recover damages arising out of the ownership,
26	common maintenance, or operation of a motor vehicle, failure to wear
27	a safety belt in violation of law may be considered evidence of
28	comparative negligence. The admissibility of such evidence shall be
29 30	determined by the court out of the hearing of the jury.
