**Subject:** Reading Scholarship Program

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STUDENT/LOANS-SCHOLARSHP EG +\$46,617,900 GF EX See Note Provides for a voucher program for certain public school students

<u>Proposed law</u> establishes the Reading Scholarship Program for eligible students. Defines eligible student as one enrolled in third, fourth, or fifth grade who scored below mastery in English language arts on the state assessment in the prior year. Gives a preference to students classified as English Language Learners. Provides for a \$500 scholarship which can be used for instructional materials, curriculum, including on-line instruction, tutoring services, summer programs, and after school programs designed to improve reading or literacy skills. Requires the Department of Education to administer such program and to submit a report to House and Senate Education Committees by April 30 each year. Provides that implementation of the program is subject to the appropriation of funds for such purpose.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

There will be an increase in expenditures to award proposed reading scholarships. An estimated \$46.6 M is required to fully fund the program based on the current number of eligible students beginning in FY 20. Future scholarship funding needs may be higher or lower depending upon student performance.
