



1           WHEREAS, requiring a person on probation or parole to meet in-person with a  
2 probation and parole officer could result in the person having to miss multiple days of work,  
3 which could hinder the person's successful reintegration into society; and

4           WHEREAS, to ensure that the person is able to comply with reporting requirements  
5 and other conditions while successfully reintegrating into society, it would be beneficial for  
6 the Department of Public Safety and Corrections to study and determine the feasibility of  
7 implementing alternatives to in-person reporting.

8           THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby  
9 urge and request the Department of Public Safety and Corrections to study and determine  
10 the feasibility of implementing alternative means by which a person on probation or parole  
11 reports to a probation and parole officer in lieu of in-person meetings.

12           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted  
13 to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections.
